IT CLEANS THE SHIPS.

Sailing Through a Volcano Crater to the Egean Sea.

In the Egean sea a vessel may sail into the top of a crater, and though it is hard to find anchorage there, yet a mere sail through is appreciated greatly by the captains, because it cleanses the bottom of the ships from marine growth.

More than 2,000 years ago the Isle of Santorin was split in half by an earthquake, with the result that what was once the crater of a volcano is now a crescent shaped harbor. Two glistening white towns of Thera and St. Nicholas are perched on the summit of the steep cliffs, whose dark and dismal hue is similar to that of the top of Vesuvius. Standing out against the sky are large numbers of windmills, with many sails, arranged in a perfect circle. These are evidently employed for crushing the olives, which, along with the terraced vines, are the staple product of the island. The Santorin wine is of excellent quality and is highly appreciated in the Levant.

Between the main island on the east and the smaller, Thera, on the west, are the three small Kaumene Islands, all of which have come into existence since the original earthquake, while the largest of the three was "born from the sea" less than 200 years ago, showing that the center of the old volcano has still a certain amount of activity.

The water in the harbor into which the sulphurous streams from this volcanic island drain has a peculiar property which completely cleans off growths of every kind from the bottom of any ship.

NOTICE TO WOOD SAWYERS

Requirements and Penalties of Ordinance No. 342.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons owning or operating any steam wood saw within the city limits to LEAVE or CAUSE to be left any deposit of SAWDUST, or other dirt or upon the street, alley, or sidewalk within the city limits of Eugene.

The person or persons operating such wood saw are hereby required to immediately remove any and all sawdust, or other dirt deposited upon any street, alley or sidewalk by such steam wood saw.

Sec. 2. Penalty for the violation of section 1, NOT LESS than \$5 nor more than \$10 and costs.

Sec. 3. Any person, firm or corporation having their wood cut or sawed by hand upon any street or alley shall immediately remove, or cause to be removed all sawdust or other litter from such street or alley.

Penalty for the violation of section 3, not less than \$5, nor more than \$10 and costs.

B. F. DORRIS, Recorder.

"Resolved, That the marshal be and is hereby instructed to make personal inspection each and every week of the streets, alleys and backyards in the business portion of the city, and see that the provisions of ordinance No. 106, approved January 2, 1890, are strictly enforced."

NOTE—Ordinance No. 106 provides for the prevention and removal of nuisances, and prohibits the throwing of straw, rubbish, or filth of any kind into the streets, alleys or backyards.
