WEATHER BUREAU. (Daily Report.)

PORTLAND, OREGON, July 21 1900-9:30 a.m. Weather forecast for Eugene, Oregon. Fair tonight and tomorrow.

SATURDAY - - JULY 21. COUNTY FINANCES.

Judge H. R. Kincaid in his paper, the Journal, says: The committee appointed by the county court to examine the records of the various officers of Lane county from November 7, 1899, up to July 12, 1900, consisting of L. H. Johnson, J. H. Potter and F. M. Wilkins, submitted their report last Monday. It shows that the warrants out standing July 12, 1900, amount to \$99,647.50. The interest now due on these warrants, which the committee did not compute, makes the present indebtedness of Lane county about one hundred and two or one hundred and three thousand dollars. Should the current expenses continue at the same rate during the next nine months as they have been, say \$5,000 per month, and over \$9,000 for June under the old board on account of election expenses—and there will be another election this year in November—the indebtedness when the next tax levy becomes due next April will be approximately \$150,000, less the taxes now due and uncollected, which will be collected in the meantime, and a small amount of fees, all amounting to \$25,000 to \$30,000. This will leave a debt of \$120,000 to \$125,000 to be paid out of the taxes 1900 and subsequent years in addition to the expenses of carrying on the county government as provided by law and the necessary road and bridge work. All of this will require careful management and strict economy if the debt shall be paid or reduced without increasing or by reducing taxes.

PRICE OF WHEAT.

Register, July 21: In the county campaign the democrats made a great howl about the low price of wheat. We find by comparison that No 2 spring wheat sold in Chicago at 85 cents last month, as against 61 1/2 cents in June, 1899. Should we make a change back to the democratic administration and prices? The price of wheat on a stock board in Chicago has nothing whatever to do with the actual price of wheat in Eugene. Today's Register quotes wheat in Eugene at 43 cents per bushel. Wheat on July 21, 1899, was quoted at 46 cents per bushel, a fall of three cents from last year. What has the Chicago market got to do with the Oregon farmer anyway?

Portland Telegram, republican: Governor Roosevelt may make a mistake if he continues to race about the country in a manner to suggest the charge up San Juan hill. The country is too big to be stamped by cow-boy whoops and rough rider dashes. Roosevelt as a rough rider in Cuba was an admirable figure, no doubt; but the people soon tire of political mimicry of such a performance, how heroic the original one might have been. The war with Spain was popular enough in itself; but some of its consequences are not being enjoyed by the American people. If Governor McKinley, it will not be on account of the Santiago campaign.

The Chicago & Rock Island road has put a ban upon cigarette smokers, and will no longer employ anybody who indulges in that form of dissipation. One of the officials says that as a rule cigarette smokers are dull and half asleep most of the time, and the road can not afford to entrust their property and trains in their keeping.

Albany Democrat: The Eugene Register says wheat is getting near the dollar mark. Very near, lacking about 55 cents of it. The editor must have dipped his pen in the lye kettle.

Reports from the drouth-stricken section of Arizona are to the effect that every water-hole and most of the wells have gone dry. In consequence cattle are dying by the thousands.

Harper's Weekly, New York Sun and New York Times, which are being quoted from just now as independent papers of democratic inclinations are owned by J. Pierpont Morgan, a republican.

We may expect some interesting news from Cuba. There are \$3,000,000 in the public treasury there, and quite a number of officeholders are still at large on the island.
