KNOX VS KINCAID.

County Judgeship Contest as Viewed by Successful Contestant. State Journal, August 11. "The contest case of O F Knox vs R Kincaid for the office of county judge was tried before Judge Hamilton in the courthouse August 8 and 9, and resulted in increasing the plurality of Kincaid, citizens' candidate, from 1 to 5 in the five precincts which Knox claimed would elect him. These were Irving, Willamette, Fairmount, Mohawk and West Cottage Grove. After the votes of these precincts had been recounted Knox's attorney, W C Hale, moved to dismiss the case without going further, and his request was granted. If the citizens' candidate gained four votes in the five precincts which the contestants claimed

would elect Knox, increasing his plurality from 1 to 5, how much would it have been increased by recounting the other 45 precincts in which the contestants did not claim anything? At the same ratio, not less than 50 and perhaps 100. "And but for the illegal votes of University students, and railroad and mill hands, and the trading of their candidates for sheriff, treasurer and school superintendent for votes for their candidate for county judge, which was done by a few officious managers who did not represent the substantial republicans in that any more than in contesting the official count made by their election judges and canvassing board, Kincaid, the citizens' candidate, would have received a majority of several hundred votes, notwithstanding the fact that the republicans have a majority of about 450 in the county on a straight vote, as shown by the votes cast for state officers."
