THE BRUTE IN MAN.

The attempted lynching of a brutal negro rapist reported by telegraph yesterday, with loss of life and destruction of valuable property, did not happen "down south." It all occurred in an orderly city of the usually staid and law-abiding state of Ohio.

Man is a curious animal. Law and religion have not yet eradicated that wild thirst for blood inherited from savage and barbarous ancestors of thousands of years ago in the dim and misty morning of his being. Disraeli, England's great prime minister, made fit illustration of man's former savagery when he taunted O'Connor, the brilliant Irish orator, with being descended from an ancestor that "ran naked and howling on the sands of Clare." It was the truth and O'Connor, perforce, remained silent under the bitter taunt.

THE SAILOR BOARDING HOUSE NUISANCE IN PORTLAND.

It seems strange that the business and commercial sentiment of Portland, year in and year out, should tolerate harassment of ship masters and ship owners by boarding-house keepers who rob the sailor and give the Columbia river a bad name abroad. In a recent case a master had a sailor boarding-house keeper arrested for unlawfully boarding his ship. It proved to be a subordinate, in the employ of the boarding-house man, and he had the captain arrested on a damage suit. Charging he was about to leave the state the master had to deposit cash bail, and will have to return to defend the \$5000 damage suit. Of course the boarding-house man will get nothing, but the people whose commerce goes out from the mouth of the Columbia may be compelled to pay higher shipping rates on account of the bad name the Port of Portland must surely get.

Instead of the masters arresting trespassers on their ships they might improve matters by simply throwing them overboard. Seriously, though, Portland's commercial sentiment should make itself felt in a way that would prevent the courts taking cognizance of such cases that are simply grounded on spite and a desire for revenge.

A unique reunion, one setting forth the life-labor of a knot-tying divine, took place at Auburn, Indiana, the other day. Rev W. L. Meese of that city, is the originator of the movement, and this was the

second reunion recorded. Some three hundred couples were present, all of whom were united in marriage by Rev Meese. The social side of the gathering was very marked, all sections of the country being represented. The question "is marriage a failure," which last year brought forth a strong negative vote, was much accentuated by a vote taken; this year has made no converts.

The Brooklyn Rapid Transit Company of New York earned \$11,768,550 carrying passengers for the year ended June 30, 1900, according to the report that has just been made public. The company paid out the enormous sum of \$797,790 during the year as damages for killing and maiming citizens.

The window glass trust has made another 10 per cent advance in prices, an even 50 per cent above what they were four years ago. While the McKinley platform "points with pride" to Republican party achievements it studiously ignores the trusts and their unwarranted advance of prices.

The day after the funeral of the millionaire railroad king Collis P. Huntington, in New York, the World of that city sententious remarked: "The funeral of the dead railroad king yesterday again recalled the Spanish proverb, 'There are no pockets in the shroud.'"

A Marion county man was fined the other day for polluting the Willamette river. He threw a dead hog in. It is not generally known, but there is a strict law against polluting any stream of the state with filth or carrion.
