ROSEATE PROSPECT.

Marion Growers Think the Hop Supply is Short and That Prices Must Advance.

WOODBURN, Oct. 8.—Hops that are moving here are principally those contracted for at 10 cents. To be have been a few sales of choice hops, ranging from 13 to 14 cents. Buyers are making every effort to discourage the growers from anticipating too much.

The opinion prevails generally among the growers here that the supply is short, the demand is greater than the supply; and that owing to much more of the '89 hops being required to make an equivalent to this year's hops in brewing, the brewers cannot hold out much longer and will begin stocking up on new hops. Imbued with this idea, the growers are holding for 15 cents, and when that is reached there will be found some who will hold on for a higher figure, but the large portion will let go at that offer, through fear of a rush crowding and slugging the market to such an extent that prices will go down and remain there.

An Extraordinary Island.
