OREGONIAN "HEADS" AND TELEGRAPHIC MATTER DISAGREE.

The member of the Oregonian editorial staff who arranges and writes heads for the telegraphic service takes delight in lying. A Grand Rapids, Michigan, dispatch of October 10, which related how Mr Bryan made 16 addresses in one day at Michigan points to "crowds that were all complimentary in size, as well as in attention given," was headed "small crowds there-Bryan's reception in Michigan not flattering."

We cannot believe the Oregonian management so prejudiced that it is willing to stand sponsor for a palpable falsehood. However this is not the first offense of the kind of which the telegraphic editor has been guilty. Professional news paper pride for reliability of the news that appears in its columns, if nothing else, should cause the Oregonian management to give its subordinate a certain lecture on the propriety of writing telegraphic heads according to the tenor of the news instead of personal prejudice.

THE BULLET AND CIVILIZATION.

Extract from speech of Bourke Cochran at Indianapolis convention of National Democratic club: "On the one side we have a suggestion of conquest, a policy of aggression, of subjugation, and when I ask a justification for it we are invited to study every possible consideration that can move the human mind. If we are covetous, we are told we must support it because trade follows the flag. In other words there is money in it. If we are humane, we are told that although trade does not follow the flag, nevertheless we must subdue them and we must manage to get reverence for the Lord and fear of the law into them by bullet and by steel, because it is our duty to civilization. (Laughter.)"

Our ambassador to Berlin, Andrew D White, is a very charitable man. In a recent interview he claims that the German emperor's speech to his soldiers directing them to kill all Chinamen with whom they came in contact was generally misinterpreted. White claims Emperor William meant that his soldiers "should bear in mind that they were going to face a desperate foe." Probably the emperor has heard of the privilege accorded our congressmen—make one speech and have a different one printed in the congressional record—and would change his tune to suit public sentiment.

Southern Pacific Earnings. SAN FRANCISCO, Oct 12.—The Southern Pacific has issued a statement of its earnings for July, the first month of present fiscal year. The gross earnings amounted to \$5,353,453, as against \$4,948,489 for the same period of last year. For the same month the earnings of the Southern Pacific, of California, which includes all the Hantington lines in the state except the Central Pacific and South Pacific Coast, were \$1,466,041. In July of last year the company's gross receipts amounted to \$1,407,692. The Central Pacific's earnings in July last were \$1,746,111, against \$1,580,443 for the same period of the year before.
