50 YEARS A REPUBLICAN.

Now Supporting Bryan and Stevenson.

PORTLAND, Oct. 18.—After being for nearly 50 years an active participant in republican campaigns in Nebraska, Judge Alonzo Perkins will vote for Bryan and Stevenson next month. Judge Perkins is now visiting relatives in Portland, and was a caller at the Bryan State Headquarters. He was a county judge for 12 years in Nebraska, and was well acquainted with Abraham Lincoln, Seward and other republicans now passed away, but whose names remain in history. The reasons Judge Perkins has for leaving the republican ranks, after half a century, he explained this morning as follows:

"The republican party has for several years been running into combinations with the money power of the land. The longer they live the closer they become, and now the money power is in control of the party."

"When I started out it was as a republican with Lincoln, Seward, Chase and that class of men. The party was made up of the working element of the country, farmers, mechanics and laboring men, as against the combined power of the commercial interests of the North and the slaveholders' power of the South, which constituted the democratic party of that day. The country is in the same condition today, between Bryan and McKinley; Bryan represents the masses, the plain people; McKinley represents the corporate interests, the banking interests of the land."

"My belief is that Bryan will be elected, for I believe that history repeats itself. When Jefferson was elected president in 1800 he was elected against interests the same as those represented by McKinley, and the representatives of the money power of that time cried out against Jefferson just as they cry now against Bryan."

"In 1828 the people stood for Jackson as against the money power, and the latter then said the country would go to the dogs if Jackson was elected. When Andrew Jackson broke down the United States bank, with its political associations, he did the best thing for the country that ever was done, and he represented the people just the same as Lincoln did in 1860 when he was elected."
