THE OREGON'S VICTORY OVER CALIFORNIA.

The victory of the University of Oregon football team over that of its big sister university down on San Francisco Bay was so complete and positive that we cannot forbear republishing most pertinent extracts from San Francisco papers, republished in the GUARD Tuesday. Here is the Chronicle:

"The University of California football team was defeated on its own campus yesterday afternoon for the first time in the ten years of Coast intercollegiate matches. The University of Oregon's little middle-weight eleven, six of them freshmen, struck the body blow to Berkeley's hopes of a clean record for this season."

"Probably in all Berkeley's campus history there was never such a disheartened and subdued crowd about the gridiron field. A little State University with 300 students had outplayed a great State University with 2300 students."

The Chronicle effectually disposes of the California excuse that mud caused their defeat:

"The conditions should have favored California. It outweighed Oregon twelve pounds to the man. Weight should count on a heavy field. The mud was as adhesive as dough. It was a bigger natural handicap to the little Oregonians than to the stronger Californians. Oregon was used to slime and watery mud, but had never before plodded in moist adobe. Persistent punting and superior generalship secured Oregon's victory."

The Examiner: "For the first time in three years the football eleven of the University of California was scored against and defeated by the sturdy little Web footers from the University of Oregon."

VICTIMS OF CIVILIZATION.

The Eskimo is the latest victim of the white man's deadly civilization. A missionary claims that half the Eskimo population along our northern coast and Alaska possessions died last summer. The missionary says:

"Prior to the coming of the white explorers they were fairly healthy—and happy. They lived largely on blubber and they kept fat and oily in consequence. Now, it has come to this that they have learned to eat the products of flour—a thing to them unknown before. The deadly pancake has come into their midst—this is literal, too—and flour bread has failed to fortify their systems against the exposures incidental to their lives."

CONSOLATION FOR BRYAN.

"If there is any consolation in it for Colonel Bryan, the Enquirer

takes pleasure in mentioning that some highly distinguished and deserving men in the United States never reached the presidency. There were Henry Clay, Daniel Webster, John C. Calhoun and Samuel J. Tilden, for instance.

"If Mr. McKinley inclines to get 'stuck up' occasionally he should remember that John Tyler and Grover Cleveland had the office; that Teddy Roosevelt had been placed in possible line for it, and that even Mr. Hanna has been mentioned as his possible successor."

French public sentiment runs very strongly against Great Britain. The enthusiastic public, almost official reception accorded ex-President Paul Kruger of the Transvaal on landing at Marseilles is ominous to the peace of Europe. France honors Oom Paul because Great Britain took and annexed his country; for nothing else. France has been at peace a long time—since 1871. Can it be that she longs for more blood, and would again unleash her eagle to fly the British lion?

That was a terrible cyclone down in Tennessee yesterday. Just think of a hurricane with a path a thousand feet wide ploughing through the suburbs of a city, wrecking, unroofing and otherwise damaging residences! That the loss of life should not be counted by hundreds instead of less than two score seems wonderful.
