TO DAILY GUARD PATRONS.

The city of Eugene covers a considerable area, especially when the extent from northwest to southeast is considered. The DAILY GUARD circulates to the extreme limits, even Fairmount people asking that the carrier service be extended to that suburb.

An evening daily cannot get to press before 5 o'clock, that is if it prints the news, and no one wants a paper that fails in that particular. These days the sun sets about 4:30 o'clock therefore the principal part of delivery of the DAILY GUARD by carriers must be made after dark.

This statement of facts is made for the benefit of subscribers who complain of late delivery of the paper. We have generally found our carriers trustworthy, but in covering such a large territory mistakes may occur. In any event the remote parts of the town cannot get the paper to them at an early hour. If we did they would not subscribe for it for there would be no news in it worth paying for.

THE USEFUL HEN.

Dried Canned Eggs the Latest Food in the Army Commissary.

The portable hen is the latest thing adopted by the commissary department of the army. It lays fresh eggs every day, is guaranteed to produce eight dozen, just as they are required, and weighs only two pounds. Requiring neither food nor water, it may be carried conveniently in a soldier's knapsack, and all he has to do when he wants an omelet or "scramble" is to unscrew the "critter" and extract the raw material from it with a spoon.

Dried egg in cans is, to speak more exactly, the army food of the immediate future. It is put up now by a number of manufacturers in various parts of the country, but chiefly in Missouri, under different trade names, such as "evaporated egg," "dehydrated egg," and "crystallized egg." From two of these firms the war department has recently purchased large quantities of the stuff, and thousands of cans of it have been shipped to China and to the Philippines for the use of our troops. One pound is equivalent to four dozen fresh eggs, and it affords an admirable substitute,

being to all intents and purposes, simply hens' eggs with the water extracted, and "keeping" for years even in a tropical climate.

Various by-products of hens' eggs are used today in interesting ways. From rotten ones is obtained an oil, useful as a lubricant, and which in Russia has been highly prized for centuries as a cure for burns. The shells—turned out in immense quantities from the dried-egg factories—are valuable for chicken feed. Some of the yolks are employed by hair-dressers, and purchased by many women to make the hair soft and glossy, and to keep the scalp in good condition. Just as in the hog-packing business, the "only part of the pig not utilized is the squeal," so, in the egg industry, nothing worth mentioning is wasted. The stale eggs, known in the trade as "seconds," are broken into omelets, each holding 30 dozen, frozen solid, and when wanted are chopped out and thawed. In this form great quantities of interior eggs are carried over from summer to winter and disposed of at a satisfactory profit.

THE WHEEL AND DIVORCE.

Of course the wheel could not keep out of the divorce court. There is a woman down in Washington county who depends on the usual "cruel and inhuman treatment" by the husband to obtain a divorce, in that the monster when they were out wheeling together, and she was physically unable to keep up with the proceero, told her that she was "no good."

Probably if she had been able to ride ahead he would not have lacked an excuse for berating her. At any rate so long as they have different bicycle gaits it is better that they pedal alone.

FOOTBALL SPECULATION.

Lineup of Multnomah Team Is Not Yet Known.

Portland Telegram, Nov. 27. "Speculation concerning the lineup of the Multnomah football team for the Thanksgiving Day game is still rife, and at this time it is hard to say just who will play.

"There are rumors that there will be many changes from the team that played the first game with Eugene, and that some of the former club players will take part in the contest. Reports come from the State University that the men are doing good work in training. They will come to this city tomorrow afternoon, and rest here over night in anticipation of the game, which will be played on the following day. The prospects are now that the field will be in good condition, and that some star plays can be made by the men who will form the two elevens."

Eastern Oregon Wheat for Valley Mills.

The Corvallis Times has some news about the wheat situation in the Willamette valley insofar as it affects millers who are short on old wheat on account of the partial failure last season. The Times says:

"It is probable that both local mills will grind a quantity of Eastern Oregon wheat into flour during the season. Both the Southern Pacific and the O.R. & N. company have made a rate of \$2.40 per ton to all Willamette valley mills for the round trip on Eastern Oregon wheat from Portland and return. That is, Corvallis millers, for instance, can buy Eastern Oregon wheat in Portland at the market price, bring it by rail to Corvallis, grind it into flour and then send it back to Portland, all for a freight charge of only \$2.40 per ton. The rate has been made by the transportation companies in order to give valley millers opportunity to secure a sufficient stock of wheat to keep their mills going and to keep all orders promptly filled. It is equivalent to a rate of only \$1.20 per ton between Corvallis and Portland which is perhaps the lowest rate ever given by the companies."
