HALF-CENTURY OREGONIAN.

On Tuesday, December 4, the Portland Oregonian rounded out a half century of existence. In commemoration of the semi-centennial of its being a special edition was issued, giving a complete history of the paper, its publishers and editors. Cuts of the old and the magnificent new home of the paper are given, also a fac-simile of the first number. It is not too much to say that comparisons between the small one-story office of 1853 and that of the palatial and modern built nine-story quarter-block structure of 1900, are not more marked than comparisons of the pioneer four-page number with the well edited progressive Oregonian of today.

The brains that made the early Oregonian a power in the new state still happily direct its business and editorial destiny. Since 1860 H. L. Pitcock has been connected with the paper as sole, or part owner, during the latter years attending to the duties as publisher. H. W. Scott, who well deserves the title of the Nestor of Oregon journalism, has directed the editorial opinions of the Oregonian since 1865, with the exception of the interval between October 1872 and April 1877. It is but a just compliment to Mr. Scott to say that his political editorials are keen and incisive, with broad grasp of public events and generally just conceptions of the character of the men who control public affairs. While partisan to a certain extent the editor possesses an independence of thought that does not deter criticism of party men and measures that are not in consonance with his views.

The Oregonian ably stands for Oregon. It is a credit to the state, a newspaper of which Oregonians may well be proud.

A CURIOUS DECISION.

The supreme court of the United States, that affirms the political rights of men without regard to color, has rendered a very peculiar decision on an appeal from a Kentucky court.

The Kentucky legislature enacted a law requiring railroad companies operating in the state to provide separate coaches for white and colored passengers. The railroads objected to being put to the additional expense and trouble, and brought suit to test the constitutionality of the law with the result that the law was held good.

That supreme court would not dare hold that a colored passenger

could not ride in any railroad coach provided for passengers on a train, on an equality with the white man, but beats the devil about the bush by compelling the railroads to provide separate coaches. Of course no negro will dare assert his right to ride in the white coaches in Southern states. If he did the passengers would attend to his case.

The wealth of John D. Rockefeller, principal stockholder of the Standard Oil Company, is beyond the grasp of the mind. Recent strong advances in the market value of the stock, ascribed to the reelection President McKinley, carry it to a valuation of \$800,000,000. Of this stock Rockefeller owns forty-three per cent. Figure it out and you will see that his share of the stock has a valuation of \$344,000,000. Such an amount of money is simply too big to think about.

England paid American horsemen over \$10,000,000 for horses and mules to use in connection with the subjugation of the Boers. Some of the smart English cavalry officials tried painting these horses a khaki, or dun brown color, when they got them to Africa to disguise them from the long range sharpshooters of the Boers and succeeded in killing every horse so treated.

Admiral Crowninshield, chief of the navigation bureau, gives congress some pointers in his annual report, which show that while we have the ships to fight a first-class naval power we have only about one-fourth of the officers and men that would be needed to fight them effectively.

Attorney General Blackburn has rendered an opinion, at the request of State Superintendent Ackerman, in which he says that the Bible may be read in the public schools of the state, and that the Lord's prayer is permissible. Now the critics will be heard from.
