## OREGON-IDAHO CONVENTION.

Annual Meeting of Y M C A to Be Held in Eugene This Week.

The annual convention of the Oregon-Idaho Young Men's Christian Association will be held here tomorrow and Saturday. There will be about 75 delegates from the various educational institutions of the two states, besides representatives from the associations at Portland, Salem, Pendleton and Oregon City. The meetings of Friday afternoon and Saturday afternoon will be held in Villard Hall, and the evening sessions in the Methodist Episcopal church.

Sunday morning at 8:45 o'clock there will be a session of one hour at the Congregational church, and at 3 p m mass meetings at the Methodist Episcopal and Baptist churches. At 6 p m a young people's mass meeting is to be held in the Christian church, after which conventions are to assemble in three other churches. The closing exercises of the convention are scheduled for 8:45 p m at the Methodist Episcopal church. Monday, Dec 10, a special assembly will be held at the University of Oregon, in honor of the visitors, and addresses will be made by a number of prominent men of the convention, including five Oregon college presidents.

Among the prominent men who are to be present may be mentioned: Fred B Smith, of Chicago, and O B Ward, of Minneapolis, both International Y M C A secretaries; P O Hanson, college secretary of Kansas; Stuart B Hanna, college secretary of the Northwest; F W Ober, of Chicago, editor of Association Men; Rev A J Montgomery, president of the Oregon City Christian Endeavor Union, and the presidents of a number of Oregon's educational institutions. The local Y M C A is making elaborate plans for the convention, which promises to be a decided success.

## The Fall of Brooklyn Bridge.

## Middle Siuslaw Road.

For about fifteen years the settlers along the Middle Siuslaw have been trying to have a wagon road built to connect with the Eugene-Florence road at the mouth of Wildcat creek. When completed it will make a continuous route from Mapleton up the entire length of the Siuslaw river, with outlets on the railroad at Drain, Cottage Grove and Eugene.

There will be considerable rock blasting, also two bridges to build at Wildcat and Wolf creek, respectively. The people along the route have subscribed liberally in work, and the county court will assist with tools and powder, and iron for the bridges.

As most of the work to be done is from four to ten miles from the homes of a majority of the settler subscribers they will be under the necessity of camping at the places of heaviest work.

While the Eugene-Florence wagon road was mainly built by the county, the people along the Middle Siuslaw have had very little help and are mainly doing the work themselves. But they will be very thankful for a little help, especially to furnish the camp with provisions, and for this end their agent will call on the people of Eugene for some assistance.

Any further explanation will be given by the agent when he calls, or by the members of the county court on application. We bespeak for these people liberal treatment, the more so as the road is not to be built by county taxation.
