SUPPORT OF UNIVERSITY.

Representative Harris Introduces a Bill For Two-Fifths Mills University Tax.

Representative Lawrence Harris, of Lane county, has introduced a bill for an act to aid in the support of the University of Oregon and to levy a tax therefor. The text of the bill is as follows:

"Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

Sec. 1.—That there be, and is hereby levied an annual tax of two-fifths of one mill on the dollar upon all the taxable property within this state for university purposes; and it is hereby made the duty of the Governor, Secretary of State, and State Treasurer, each year, after ascertaining in the manner now provided, or which may hereafter be provided by law, the rate of taxation in mills and decimals of a mill, to be levied for state purposes, to add thereto the tax hereby, and the same shall be collected as other state taxes are collected, and paid into the state treasury, and kept separate from other funds, and shall be known as the university fund.

"Sec. 2.—That the fund arising from said tax, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be, and the same is hereby appropriated annually, for the support and maintenance of the University of Oregon, and to keep the building, ground and other property thereof in repair, and for the construction of buildings and additions to the library and laboratory facilities.

"Sec. 3.—That all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent herewith be, and the same is hereby repealed; provided, such repeal shall not affect the present income of the University under any act appropriating money therefor, or in aid thereof, until the tax herein provided for shall be levied and collected."

[Formerly the State University had a special tax of one-seventh of a mill levied on the taxable property of the state for its benefit. This was afterward changed to a fixed appropriation of \$50,000 a year, the amount now received by the University exclusive of interest from the fund provided from the sale of lands appropriated by congress for its support.

If the bill introduced by Representative Harris becomes a law it will provide about \$45,000, with the chance of a small yearly increase on condition of an increase in the taxable property of the state.—Ed.]

Dr. Edward Everett Hale, in spite of his years, continues to be active in the work of the Boston Associated Charities and himself does much of the necessary personal investigation and visiting among the poor of the city.

The late Henry Villard gave away a great deal of money during his lifetime. In addition to numerous benefactions bestowed on European charitable and educational institutions, he contributed liberally to the American objects.
