BODY ARRIVED.

Remains of the Late John F
Brewer, Soldier, Received at
Goshen.

The body of John F. Brewer, son of Mr. and Mrs. John H. Brewer, of Goshen, arrived at that place yesterday from the Philippine Islands via San Francisco, for burial. The funeral will not occur till perhaps Thursday to allow time for the arrival of the deceased soldier's relatives who reside in Eastern and Southern Oregon and who have been telegraphed for.

John F. Brewer, who resided with his parents near Goshen, enlisted as a private in Co. E, 35th Regiment, U. S. Volunteers, recruited at Vancouver, Wash., in the fall of 1899. Shortly after the regiment was organized it left on a transport from Portland for the Philippines. The regiment did considerable active service in quelling the Filipino insurrection, and during a small engagement on October 30, 1900, Private Brewer was killed by a shot from an ambush.

Private Brewer was a young man of excellent reputation and had many friends in this county. He was a member of Goshen Tent, No. 54, Knights of the Macabees. At the time of his enlistment in the 35th Regiment he was a member of Separate Co. C, O. N. G., under Capt. J. M. Williams, of this city. He will, in all probability, be given a military funeral, conducted by the local companies.

ELECTRIC LIGHT PLANT.—Cottage

Grove Nugget, Jan 25: Work on the electric light plant is going steadily on and Mr. Abrams announces that the plant will be in running order in the course of fifteen days. In speaking of the time consumed in rebuilding the plant Mr. Abrams states that the setting of machinery is always slow and especially so when the climatic conditions interfere as has been the case in this instance. The new 36-inch turbine water wheel which will drive the machinery, was received by Mr. Stone last Monday and was placed in position this week. When the stage of the river will permit, the dynamo will be run by water power, and other times the power will be generated from the two big boilers now in position at the rear of the building. Line-men T. A. Abrams and A. Nelson have been going over the old line tightening and resetting poles and by the time the machinery is in position all the little details will be completed and then let'er shine.

ris, of Lane county, has introduced a bill that will doubtless meet with the approval of prospectors and mining men. The bill makes the defacing, pulling down or changing of mining notices a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of \$500, or imprisonment in the county jail for a period of six months.
