PARADE TO BE FORMED.

Sunday evening, May 20, Colonel Moran and staff, with Companies A and C, O N G, as escort, will form on Willamette street, right resting on Tenth. J W Geary Post, G A R, Women's Relief Corps, Ladies of the G A R, and Sons of Veterans will form on Ninth street, right resting on Willamette, in the order named at 7:15 sharp, and march without delay, to the Christian church, where the Memorial sermon will be preached by Rev Mac H Wallace, assisted by the several ministers of the city. The public are most cordially invited to attend this service.

MEMORIAL DAY, THURSDAY, MAY 23.

The exercises for the day will be as follows: Promptly at 10 a.m., under orders of Comrade C W Baker as marshal, and Bert H Miller and F E Taylor as assistants, Colonel Moran and staff, Companies A and C, O N G, as escort, will form on Willamette street, right resting on Tenth. J W Geary Post, W R C, Ladies of the G A R, and S of V, in the order named, will form on Ninth street, right resting on Willamette. The public school children will form on Oak street, right resting on Ninth, facing north. Mayor and City council in carriages, citizens in carriages and on foot will form on Oak street, right resting on Ninth, facing south.

Promptly at 10:30 the line will move under the marshal's and assistants' orders. Moving south on Willamette to Eleventh street, east on Eleventh to Hilyard, south on Hilyard to Thirteenth, east on Thirteenth to county road, thence to the cemetery. After exercises by the G A R and Philippine veterans, the line will be dismissed.
