CHINA AFFAIRS ABOUT SETTLED.

A London dispatch says that with the agreement of the Chinese government to pay four per cent interest on the two hundred and seventy-three millions indemnity, previously agreed upon, the last obstacle to the withdrawal of foreign troops has been removed. The dispatch says:

It has been a long chapter of diplomacy, with nearly twelve months of intrigue, but the end has been reached without the partition of China or any disturbance of the relations of the powers. The German emperor has probably scored more heavily than anybody else. He has obtained from England joint rights for the guardianship of the Yangtze Valley without estranging Russia, and Von Waldersee has been in command of the allied forces, and the most conspicuous figure in a complex diplomatic drama in which ingenious by-play has not been lacking.

Rather fortunate that Decoration Day weather was not of this two days later variety.

Forecast Official Beals forecasts the highest water from the Columbia at Portland for this season, Sunday, at the twenty-one foot mark. Thirty-three feet is the record high-water mark.

Portland health authorities very properly have decided that all smallpox cases must go to the pest-house. Heretofore exceptions have been made, resulting in new cases. The city has nine cases under treatment.

An unofficial statement from Washington represents that the census of last year shows a colored population of 8,500,000 in the United States. This is a trifle more than one million of an increase during the past ten years.

Horse-stealing is an aggravated offense, though not so serious as the people of Modoc county, California, would make it. They hung five persons in one lot down there the other day for appropriating miscellaneous horse-flesh.

The omission of a single letter from a word is liable to confuse the sense of the writer. For instance an editorial in the GUARD yesterday, on "Decoration Day," referred to graves as "making mounds." It was written "marking mounds."

Mary Ellen Lease, the noted agitator, has filed a petition in bankruptcy in New York. She gave her liabilities as \$3,247.55, and her assets at \$2,293.75. The petitioner says much of the indebtedness is as indorser of mortgages given by her husband.

The origin of the tiger as an emblem of Tammany is said by W. O. Montanye, a coffee and spice dealer

in New York, to date from the time when William M. Tweed, then foreman of the "Big Six" fire company, took a fancy to a picture of a royal Bengal tiger in the elder Montanye's store in the '50's. Tweed adopted the emblem for the American club, and it soon was accepted by all Tammany.

That paper money is nothing but a promise to pay was demonstrated by the death of Colonel James G. Miner, an assistant secretary of the Confederate navy during the Civil war, at Milford, Ohio, the other day. While he died in poverty, one million dollars in Confederate money and bonds were found in his trunk.

How old does a man have to get to lose interest in worldly affairs? A Riddle correspondent in the Roseburg Review writes that "Mr. Keer, 99 years and 10 months old, of Cottage Grove, has gone to his mine on the Umpqua, near Perdue. The old gentleman, who is still quite active, thinks that he would not live more than five years longer if he didn't work."

Australian papers state that the experiment of the West Australian government in turning domestic cats loose in the southeastern districts of the colony to check the invasion of rabbits from South Australia has been a pronounced success. The cats destroyed immense numbers of the pests, and in some places almost cleared the equatorial places of the rabbits.

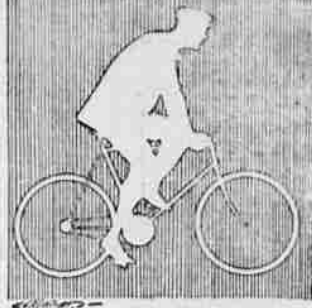
