MYTHICAL ENGLISH FORTUNE.

Henry Gilfrey in London After Purported Baskett Estate.

A sister of the former Bristol young man, "Laf" and Wm. W. Bristol married a Polk county man in pioneer days by the name of Baskett. It seems that the latter family has been enticed by the old story of a fortune in England awaiting heirs to send Henry Gilfrey, a cousin, on a fool's errand. The following dispatch is explanatory: "London, May 23.—H. H. Gilfrey, a legislative clerk of the United States, is here endeavoring to trace the estate of William Baskett, supposed to have been a London banker, and said to have recently died, leaving \$6,000,000, the principal heirs being the Basketts, of Polk County, Oregon. A story purporting to have originated in London and giving details of the death was printed in a Salem, Or. paper. Gilfrey is unable to find the slightest trace of Baskett, and the death of a man answering the description has not been recorded at Somerset House, the office of the registrar of births, deaths and marriages."
