FORTY-NINE THOUSAND TROOPS LEFT.

No volunteers are now in the Philippines. The control of affairs is turned over to the forces of the regular establishment. There have been more than seventy-six, thousand officers and soldiers in the islands the past winter, most of whom were volunteers.

There is no longer reasonable question that the last of the volunteers will reach San Francisco by July 1, where they must be discharged from the army with the expiration of the volunteer service on that date. The last steamer bearing men from Manila for home is now due at San Francisco.

Forty-nine thousand troops are left in the islands, and of these it is proposed to bring home nine thousand in order to reduce the total force in the Philippines to forty thousand, the strength estimated by the War Department officials as ample for the present.

It is to be hoped that the report about King Edward winning twenty thousand pounds, (\$100,000) since the racing season began is without foundation; or rather that the King gambler at all, now that he fills probably the most exalted and responsible position in the world. The ruler may have vices—if so he should keep them from the public gaze. What was looked on as the wildness of a prince is held disgraceful in the king.

Crops are reported very poor in Germany this year. Under such conditions the industrial expansion boom that has been largely exploited throughout the country may follow the route of many other booms—become a panic. The failure of the big Leipziger bank of Berlin for a sum representing over twenty millions of our money looks ominous.

After that Uncle Tom Cabin performance last night who will contend that mob law is not justifiable occasionally? After admitting a crowd that was larger than their seating capacity, they made seats of rough boards and charged ten cents extra for the privilege of sitting upon them. Spoilt eggs would have suited the occasion.

The powers professed no intention of partitioning China, yet are obtaining concessions, secret or otherwise, that will render future partition a matter of easy accomplishment. The European land-hunters never fully release their grip from territory once in possession.

The plentiful spring rains have made crops certain. The Willamette Valley has had many seasons of full promise, but none to exceed the present.

A novel race will be determined in Berlin some time near noon tomorrow. One hundred and fifty-five automobiles or horseless carriages, including a few motor bicycles, left Paris on a race for the Prussian capital early yesterday morning. They should reach Berlin tomorrow afternoon. One woman competitor entered the race.
