THE NORTHWEST AND TYLER.

In 1840 the United States rang with the Whig cry of "Tippecanoe, and Tyler too." Yet his grave in a Richmond, Virginia, cemetery, so Colonel D M Dunne of Portland, recently returned from a visit East, tells the Portland Telegram, is marked by but a six-inch mound of earth and a small headstone. President Tyler saved Oregon and the Northwest to the United States. Our people could show no more grateful appreciation of the fact than to erect a monument over the grave of the president whose name is indissolubly linked with this great section of our common country.

But the rains poured, and more clouds came, and at last Agent Buford, alarmed for the old man's safety, carried off the tom-tom and declared the two-barrel-of-flour bargain off. And to this day the Indians believe that the only reason why the medicine man failed was because Agent Buford did not allow him to go on with his incantations.

The quality of French roads is shown by the first day's run of the automobiles racing between Paris and Berlin, Thursday. The leader drove his heavy machine weighing over a ton over the common graded wagon road 285 miles, arriving at the stopping post in less than seven hours, an average of 45 miles an hour.
