Seattle, June 28.—A man walked up to the flagpole in Skagway the other day, and without hesitation, calmly pulled down the British ensign, to the astonishment of crowds of onlookers. The matter caused intense excitement there, and may yet become an international affair, as the Canadians will ask no apology from our Government for the act.

The man who pulled the flag down was angry because it floated in the breeze above the Stars and Stripes. Several remarks had been passed on the matter before, but no one thought it would be interfered with. A Canadian official came up to the man who pulled it down and asked him why he had done so, and to his astonishment the man pulled a card from his pocket which read, "George M. Miller, Attorney-at-Law, Eugene, Ore." Then Miller walked away, without saying a word. He is a brother of Joaquin Miller, the well-known poet. There was intense excitement at Skagway over the event.
