Clipped From the West of June 28

The Lillian is giving an excursion to the beach each Sunday when the weather permits.

Rev. Thompson, who was in Florence last summer and fall, will again have charge of the Presbyterian church work on the St. Lawrence.

Fraser & Griffin have closed their logging camp near Glentana on account of lack of water at the dam for flooding out their logs. They have four or five hundred logs out in the woods which they will probably put in next fall.

Married, at the residence of the bride's parents, in Astoria, Oregon, Sunday, June 23, 1901, Andrew J. Wilkinson to Miss Mattie A. Sweet. The bride is the daughter of Mr. Frank Sweet, one of the early settlers of the St. Lawrence.

We are informed that the residents of the upper river have formed a combination, the members of which have agreed not to sell any logs not already cut, unless they are sealed on the bank and partly paid for before they are put into the river.

The greater part of the road from Mapleton to Eugene is in good condition, but a number of bridges need to be rebuilt or repaired and considerable work should be done to put the road in shape between Mapleton and the mouth of Lake Creek. Some corduroy was put on this part last winter, but aside from this there has not been much expended on it for a year or two.

Herbert S. Murch.

Herbert S. Murch, graduate of the University of Oregon of the class of 1898, and during the past year a student in the graduate department, has been granted a scholarship for next year in the department of English at Yale University.

It is a matter of interest that, while Mr. Murch's application was not received at Yale until all the usual fellowships and scholarships were awarded, the faculty voted to award what was practically a scholarship in addition to the usual number, on account of his work already done in the University of Oregon.

Mr. Murch was regarded as one of the best students in his class while in college, and won the Fulbright prize for oratory, on the day of his graduation. He lives at Corvallis, and is 24 years of age.
