A HELP TO OREGON.

Prune Growers Are Aided by Drouth Failures in the East.

SALEM, Aug. 5.—Prunegrowers in this section expect that prices for dried fruit will be materially aided by the drouth in the Eastern states. Private advices confirm previous reports that the fruit crop east of the Rocky mountains has been greatly damaged. Already prune dealers are receiving inquiries concerning Oregon prunes, while before the drouth they had to hunt the Eastern buyers. Several weeks ago the outlook for prices was very poor and growers took a discouraging view of that phase of the crop. A large yield was promised, however, so the Oregon growers could see their way out in spite of low prices, and the growers are happy. There is also reason to believe that California prunes may again be tied up by the Cured Fruit Association, and if this should occur, the market for Oregon fruit will be enlarged.
