OUR PANAMA INTERESTS.

The war between Venezuela and Colombia is of the greatest interest to the United States. We are bound by a stipulation of the treaty of 1845 with the republic of New Granada, now Colombia, to prevent any interruption of traffic across the isthmus of Panama. By it we guarantee, "positively and efficaciously," to protect the neutrality of the isthmus and of the means of communication across it—now by rail, of course; and to maintain the rights of sovereignty and property of Colombia over the territory of that isthmus.

We have been called on in the past to do this several times. In 1864, Spain wished to transport troops and war munitions across the isthmus to carry on war against Peru, but relinquished the idea on learning that this government would feel itself bound to prevent such action. And in 1881, Secretary of State Blaine declared that "there has never been the slightest doubt that the United States under this treaty became surety alike for the free transit of the world's commerce and for the protection of the territorial rights of Colombia from aggression or interference of any kind."

The size of the job the British have on hand in South Africa may be estimated from the statement that they are feeding about one-third of the white people of the two republics in military prisons or camps of concentrations, besides having to run down scattered guerrilla bands. The white population numbers about two hundred thousand. It is surprising that such a comparatively small number of people could carry on a war with such a great military power so long. The great extent of wild country and the facility with which Boer commands dissolve and come together again, like American Indians, account for the long-drawn-out struggle.

The railway companies entering Berlin have recently adopted the American plan [with modifications] enabling passengers to check baggage to their homes before arrival of the train.

The powers are taking their time about evacuating Pekin, and the Chinese court is taking its time in returning to the capital. The Chinese rulers are bound to maintain the fiction of their supremacy.

The Catholic church is not slow to recognize the new order of affairs in the Philippines. Of nine new bishoprics seven will be presided over by Americans.

London, Paris, Berlin and other European cities will soon have underground mail and parcel tubes.
