FREIGHT CAR FAMINE.

From the Ashland Tidings.
The wall of distress from the freight car famine goes up all over the land, and it seems to be louder and longer in the East and Middle West than on the Pacific Coast. The signs of improvement and indications now are that there will be no relief throughout the winter. The oil shippers of Southern California want cars, and the lumber mills of Northern California and the Willamette Valley are seriously curtailed in their output lack of rolling stock for the shipment of their product. The same story comes from across the mountains. Chicago advices say that grain receipts have fallen off materially owing to the scarcity of cars, and the merchandise movement, while fairly liberal would be on an enormous scale if cars were obtainable. Farmers in the Northwest are anxious to market their heavy crop of spring wheat at the present very satisfactory prices, but cars are not to be had. Millers of the Northwest are suffering from the same cause, and shippers at Chicago want to send corn and wheat to the South, but their hands are tied owing to insufficient rolling stock. There are no cars for hauling coal on the Pennsylvania and West Virginia railroads and mines and rolling mills are threatened with a suspension of operations.

A Multnomah county deputy county clerk took the liberty to issue marriage licenses after the death of his superior with the result that several couples find themselves in a very annoying predicament. The county judge holds that the deputy had no right to issue the marriage licenses. The experience of the short supposedly married life will be to the benefit of the contracting parties. Some of them may want to declare the engagements off.

The postoffice department claims knowledge that a thousand or more second and fourth class postmasters have been swindled out of sums ranging from two hundred and fifty to a thousand dollars by "green goods" men who professed to be able to furnish postage stamps at a big discount. The sharpers got the

money and, of course, did not furnish the goods. And the postmasters did not dare to make complaint.

William Brannon, who for nearly a decade has suffered ostracism from the American turf, has been reinstated at Latonia. The offense which made Mr Brannon an outcast, was the supposed "ringing in" of the noted old horse Tanner under the name of Polk Budget at Latonia, on which he cleaned up something like \$30,000.

A barber who runs a shop on Harvard Square in Cambridge was fined \$20 the other day for refusing to shave a negro student at the University. The barber denied refusing the negro, but the judge took the evidence of the negro in preference to that of the barber. In Boston and Massachusetts generally, the color line is not drawn.

It is a case of guesswork as to who will govern Central American republics tomorrow or next day. Colombia has a small sized revolution on hand, but it will not interfere with the Isthmus railroad. The strong arm of Uncle Sam will see that railroad communication is not disturbed.

The news that President Roosevelt will recommend the re-enactment and strengthening of the Chinese exclusion law will cause no surprise, still he is entitled to the gratitude of our Pacific Coast people, especially, for his stand in the matter. We have no use for Chinamen.

Occasionally we find an independent federal official. The Brooklyn, New York, postmaster—and it is a good office—has resigned because his superiors at Washington forced an undesirable appointment in his office.
