THE OIL WELL.

The Drill is Going Through Gold-Bearing Rock.

The new drills ordered by the Great West Oil and Coal Co for their Springfield oil drilling machine has not yet arrived, consequently progress is not very fast. The drills now used are too soft and flatten out in going through the rock encountered at present. So far the drill has gone down only 15 or 16 feet.

Some gold is found in the rock through which they are drilling. The rock goes about 70 cents to the ton, and might be such a thing that a gold mine is found in connection with the oil.

LUCKY BOY STRIKE

Thought to Be Richest Ever Made in the State.

THREE THOUSAND PER DAY

Estimated That \$1,000,000 is in Sight.

A GREAT MINE.

Further reports from the fabulously rich strike made the other day in the Lucky Boy mine, an account of which was printed exclusively by the GUARD yesterday, indicate that the strike is one of the richest if not the richest ever made in any mining camp in Oregon.

The four-foot ledge where this discovery has been made is in a 150-foot tunnel and the new ledge has been uncovered for a distance of 50 feet.

The ore assays from \$500 to \$800 per ton right along and it is estimated that there is \$1,000,000 in sight to say nothing of what will be found as the work is extended. It is expected that the ledge will run clear to the grass roots above.

The ore is so rich that it is impossible to save near all of the gold by running it through the stamp mill in the regular way, so five stamps have been detached from the mill and this rich grade of ore is being run through slowly by hand. It is estimated that at present \$3000 per day is being ground out and there is no idea how much farther this splendid ledge will run.

We are informed that the richest specimens from this great discovery will be sacked and brought to Eugene for shipment to the reduction works.

REFUSED \$200,000 FOR THE MINE.

Only recently the owners of the Lucky Boy mine, Messrs Fred and Frank Sharkey, L Zimmerman and N B Standish, refused \$200,000 offered by English capitalists for the mine. They acted wisely in refusing, as this new strike demonstrates that the mine is worth many times that amount.

This new discovery puts the Lucky Boy in the same class with the greatest mines of Eastern Oregon and California.

It means much to Eugene and this section of the state, as the news of the immensity of the find will attract capital from far and wide to the Blue River district.

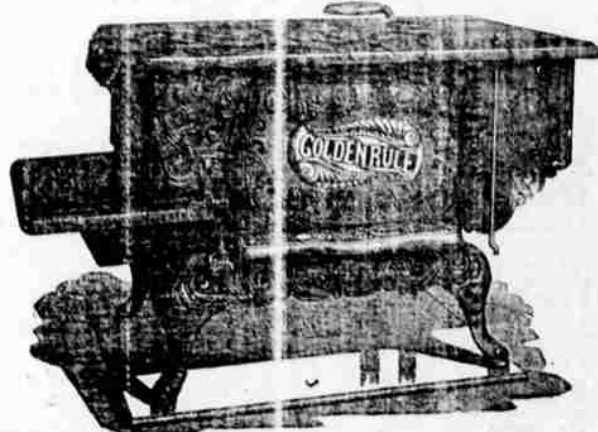
