MID-OCEAN TELEGRAPHY.

A New York dispatch of December 16th says the transatlantic Cunarder Etruria, which had just arrived there, was in communication for more than five hours in mid-ocean with her sister ship, the Umbria. Long before either ship sighted the other, their commanders were conversing by the Marconi wireless system. The position of each ship was known on the other hours before their main trucks showed above the horizon.

The Etruria left Liverpool on December 7, the same day the Umbria steamed out of New York. They were 1630 mile east northeast of Sandy Hook when they passed each other on Wednesday, or in latitude 45.17 and longitude 51.07. Five hours before that, or when they were fully 100 miles apart, the receiver on the Etruria began to click warningly. The operator replied, and then the word "Umbria" was slowly spelled out on the Etruria's instrument. Then followed the Umbria's location. The Etruria replied, giving her location, which showed her to be fully 100 miles away from the other vessel.

The Umbria sent her number of passengers, the fact that all was well and the latest news from New York. The Etruria sent word of the burning of the great Liverpool Exchange Quadrangle, which occurred on December 6, while the Etruria was lying in the Mersey.

Portland is rapidly coming to the front as a redwood distributing point. During the next forty days says the Timberman, over 2,000,000 feet of redwood will leave Portland for foreign ports. The distances from Eureka, California, to San Francisco and Portland are about equidistant, with the advantages in favor of Portland. Where a mixed cargo of lumber is being shipped any vessel would prefer to have her cargo all aboard at one port, instead of having to make two clearances, with its attendant loss of time and additional expense.

The Multnomah county circuit court granted six divorces yesterday, three to husbands and three to wives. One woman was granted a divorce on the simple evidence that on going home from the theatre one night her husband became abusive and butted his head against a stone wall. If he had butted her head against the wall there would have been good reason for the divorce, but it must appear to a disinterested observer that the court granting divorce on such evidence is of a very accommodating turn of mind.

A Baker county miner is under arrest for stealing thirteen pounds of ore. It seems a little matter at first glance, but rather serious when it is known that the thirteen

pounds of rock carried somewhere from seven hundred to a thousand dollar's worth of gold. A lot of ore from the same mine recently yielded twelve thousand and five hundred dollars to the ton. A solid ton of gold would be worth from three to four hundred thousand dollars, according to fineness.

Galveston, Texas, is bankrupt, the result of the great storm that drove the waters of the Gulf of Mexico into and over it last year. The Texas legislature has provided for a commission, in other words receivers, to take charge of the city and pro rata debt payments. It is not unusual for corporations and individuals to go the bankrupt route but seldom the fate of a city.

The political complexion of the present Congress is as follows: Senate, 55 Republicans and 33 Democrats, two seats being vacant; Republican majority, 22; House, 198 Republicans and 159 Democrats, Republican majority 39. The Populists have disappeared. The country, politically, is completely in the hands of the Republican party.

WAR ON FOOTBALL.

A List of the Dead for the 1901 Season.

Quite a determined spirit is evinced by many persons of the east to have football further deprived of the probability of fatality. Since the "Flying wedge" and one or two other plays found to be especially hard on the members of the teams, have been abolished, fewer accidents of a serious nature are noted. But some people view the aggregate casualties and think the candle wrong more than the game. Several colleges and universities are enlisted in the effort to modify the plays further, that skill and vigor are not eliminated, but to forbid such plays as call simply for brute force of hurrying one team against another, in a test adapted more to show which has superior weight than which is capable of best judgment and keenest thought.

Those listed on the death roll for the season are: Leon Ayers, aged 19, of Janesville, Wis, was driven insane in a game and committed suicide; John Buckner, aged 11, died in a game at Kirksville, Mo; Chas Busckman, aged 19, living at 87 Kedzie avenue, Chicago, was paralyzed in a game and died next day; Silas Higo, of Champlain, Michigan, was injured in a game on October 19, and died next day; Edwin Longueker, aged 21, quarter of Brown Preparatory School, had his spine fractured and died in a few hours; Robert McWard, teacher at Brush college, near Taylorville, Ill, died during a game with his pupils; John Segrist, Columbus, Ohio, died as a result of having his spine twisted in a game with Ohio university; David Ward, Philadelphia, was instantly killed on the field; John Dintine, of Huntington, Ind, aged 17, was internally injured in a high school game and died soon after; and William power, of Auburn, Neb, aged 19, was fatally injured in a game at Auburn, near St Joseph, Mo, last Saturday, one arm being broken and all the ribs on the left side crushed in.
