CENSUS YEAR, (1900), POPULATION AND MILITARY SERVICE.

The census bureau has issued a report announcing that the population of the United States, including all outlying possessions, was 84,233,069 in the census year of 1900. This is itemized as follows:

United States proper, 75,994,575;
 Philippines, 6,961,339; Porto Rico, 953,243; Hawaii, 154,001; Alaska, 63,592; Guam, 9000; American Samoa, 6100; Persons in the military and naval service of the United States, outside territory and the United States proper, 91,219.

There are but three countries which now have a greater population than the United States, viz. China, the British Empire and the Russian Empire.
