HANGING DEMORALIZATION.

Take hangings to the penitentiary—anywhere to get them away from the communities where the murder, the trial, the sentence, the preparations for hanging, all have been discussed in the family circle, on the streets, in the newspapers, until the public nerve is tense with excitement. While the world is better off without the criminals, they harm public welfare even in their last fateful moments. Get them out of public mind as much as possible! Hang them at the penitentiary!

COUNT TOLSTOI'S SUCCESSOR.

The young Russian novelist, Maxim Gorky, is causing the representatives of the czar no little concern. The history of Gorky is most romantic. He was born in 1868, the son of a poor upholsterer, and lost both father and mother while yet a child. He became assistant to a mechanical draughtsman, garden laborer and turnspit on a river steamer. It happened that the steamer's cook was a bookish person, and from him Gorky imbibed his first literary impulses. Later his misery was so extreme, almost as a common tramp, that he attempted suicide. He tried for the army, but was rejected as physically unfit. At last he found a patron who made him his secretary. He had traveled from Besarabia to Tiflis, suffering unheard-of privations and consoling himself with the most unfortunate of the earth.

At this time he was putting his sorrows and his deep knowledge of the woes of his native people into words of literature. These rapidly won the public heart, and have made him the most dreaded influence with which official Russia has to contend.
