THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

A state and county election is about on hand and candidates are being discussed on both sides. As usual the sheriff's office is mentioned more than any other.

On the part of the allied political forces that make up the opposition to that great party of trusts and Asiatic territorial achievements, we have heard but one name mentioned by people from all parts of the county. There seems to be a general disposition on the part of the union forces to renominate Sheriff Withers. We believe that his renomination would not only be good, sound political policy, but, more than that, a simple matter of justice to the man who has made a careful and efficient official.

The people are aware of the misfortune that befell Sheriff Withers in the defalcation of a trusted deputy—a man who stood high in public estimation, in lodge circles, and with firm, personal friends numbered by the hundreds without regard to political prejudices. That man betrayed the trust reposed in him. Sheriff Withers acted the man in every particular. When the blow came he was the first man to ask that the books be experted. When the amount of which he, not the county, had been robbed was definitely known he made it good. It mattered not to him that his savings of nearly two years of office were swept away, and more; that he had to place a mortgage on the farm which he left to come to Eugene. He settled the deputy's defalcation and started anew, a poorer man than when he took office, with nearly two years of hard work lost.

We do not believe there will be the least opposition to the renomination of Sheriff Withers. We know that public sentiment favors his reelection.

ABOUT SOME ROADS OUT WEST.

Iverson, Feb. 10. EDITOR GUARD.—A recent number of the Register had a letter from C. W. Lyons, of Walton, in which he says we don't pay taxes enough, and that the county built our roads. It is true that the county has paid out considerable money on our roads during the last two or three years. It is also true that Mr. Lyons has drawn from four to six hundred dollars in the last year and a half.

As this is my third term as supervisor I know how much work has been done on the roads. Many of our people have worked from 5 to 20 days a year on the roads and still they were had. We have worn out our mattocks and shovels digging. We never even had a plow nor scraper till last week. I was in Eugene on the 5th when the court gave us a good plow and scraper.

Mr. Lyons is the only man over here to say that we don't pay enough taxes. Many of us think we pay more than we should. We have very little land cleared and are not in condition to pay much tax.

SPRING ATHLETICS.

Multnomah-Oregon Meet to Be In Portland

COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC LEAGUE. O. agonism: The season for track and field sports is fast approaching, and there will be some good, lively contests when the young athletes round into form. About the only event of the kind which will be held in Portland during the spring will be the dual meet between the M. A. C. and the University of Oregon. Last year Oregon won over Multnomah by a score of 61 to 43, but as the University has lost Heater and Poley, two of its best men, the indications point to a very even contest with Multnomah this year.

If the dual meet is to furnish the excellent sport that it did last year, both institutions will have to develop some very clever novices, for the only old record-breakers left are Kerrigan, of the M. A. C., and Payne, the crack middle-distance man of Oregon. Multnomah still has Gamble in the sprints and Murphy in the hurdles and field events, while Zan will look out for the distance runs and discus throw. The University has lost both Wagner and Smith, the crack weight-throwers, but as the weights are not included in the program with Multnomah, their absence will not be noticed so much as in the collegiate games, where weights and all are included. The training at the University will be under the supervision of ex-Captain Redmond, who will be assisted by the sprints by Lewis, the crack 100-yard man. Among the new students are several promising athletes and it is certain that some good material will be developed.

ATHLETIC LEAGUE. The college Athletic League of Oregon, which includes McMinnville college, Albany college, Pacific college, Dallas college and the Moonshot normal school, will hold its second annual field meet at McMinnville early in June. Last year Albany college came out victor, but the presence of the phenomenal Heater at Pacific college almost insures victory to the Newberg institution. Pacific and Willamette universities expect to be well represented on the track this year and will contest in a dual meet. Pacific expects to encounter the University of Oregon, the university of Washington and Whitman college.
