SENATOR KUYKENDALL'S COON-DOG STAND.

Talk about a double back-somer-sault! Senator Kuykendall beats it. In his speech the other day explaining his vote against the appropriation to compensate Indian War veterans he said he voted against the thirty thousand dollar appropriation because, as he truly said, it was not enough. Later in his speech, most wonderful to relate, the Senator claimed credit for saving the state thirty thousand dollars by his vote. He can take class with the negro's coon-dog, that caught them both "comin' and goin'."

If you favor the old veterans getting their just dues Senator Kuykendall is with you. If you think it in the interest of state economy that they get nothing Senator Kuykendall is with you. He catches on "comin' and goin'."

The devil rebuking sin is not to be compared to the statement of the Oregonian's Washington correspondent that "It is understood by Oregon men here that certain trusts are preparing to bring whatever influence they can to defeat the Republican party in Oregon."
