SOME PERTINENT QUESTIONS.

Register: The Salem Journal, which before election yelled itself hoarse over the extravagance of the last legislature, now wants a useless special session of the same legislature held at an expense of \$25,000 just to please our retiring governor T. T. Geer. The people won't stand for it.

Let us see! Did not the Register keep the Republican state platform running in its columns during the campaign? And did not one plank of that platform pledge the Republican party to enact legislation that would cut off the enormous fees and perquisites now enjoyed by state officials? And would not failure to legislate on the state official fee and salary abuse before the officers elect take their respective positions allow them to draw present compensations for the next four years—the term for which they are elected? And would a special session of the legislature cost \$25,000, as stated by the Register?

"The people won't stand for it?" Does not the Register really mean that the politicians and officials who hope to reap reward and excessive compensation at the expense of every taxpayer do not "stand for it?"
