BRITISH CORONATION MILITARY DISPLAY.

King Edward and queen will be crowned king and queen of the British dominions in a little less than two weeks. The coronation extends from Monday, June 23, to Saturday, July 5. Here is the program for the principal two days:

Thursday, June 26—The coronation. Friday, June 27—Procession through London, which will be a military pageant some two miles long, representing every portion of the British dominion.

That procession will be worth seeing. Still it may not exceed in interest that review of the soldiers of the Union army within reach of Washington at the close of the Civil War when two hundred thousand battle-worn veterans, fresh from fields of carnage, clad in their service uniforms and bearing the rifles that for months and years had dealt death to the enemy, passed before the President and his reviewing staff. CLEAN UP—KEEP CLEAN.

E C Cole, socialist candidate for county clerk at the late election, goes into rhapsodies over twins presented him. He should not be too sure about having augmented the Socialist vote "twenty-one years hence, as he wrote the GUARD. Something may happen to make that boy a bloated monopolist by that time. He also says he "feels twice as well as he had been elected," presumably on account of the double harvest. We have seen men who looked otherwise when they received news of such an event at their home.
