FOR A GREATER OREGON.

Mr G M McKinney, the general immigration agent of the Harriman lines of railroad, is preparing to carry on a systematic and thorough campaign for increasing the population and therefore the production of Oregon, and is properly meeting with due encouragement from the business men of the various cities which he visits. While his central headquarters are at Chicago, he will have sub-agents at various other points in the Middle West, who will make a business of furnishing information to the people of those regions concerning Oregon and other Pacific Coast States traversed by the Union Pacific, O R & N, Central Pacific and Southern Pacific Railroads.

For every person now living in these states ten might easily and comfortably exist, finding ample sustenance and opportunity, and this multiple is a very moderate one. The railroads need these men to become producers here, and to enlarge imports as well as exports, and so to increase and even multiply the business of the railroads. But our state and cities, our business men, also need this influx of new people. With them added to our present population we can build up great manufacturing, employing hundreds of thousands of people; our commerce will grow apace; our undeveloped resources will be utilized; farming lands will be brought into a higher state of cultivation and become more valuable; our mines will be opened up and their treasures extracted; in parts of Oregon we will have the finest dairy farms, thousands of them, in the United States; our dairy, fruit, lumber and other products will attain world-wide celebration of our property will amount up to several hundred million dollars, and the tax rate will fall; it will be easier to improve our cities and build roads—in a word, with a large influx of the right kind of immigrants we shall rapidly develop into a far more rich, self-reliant, prosperous and notable state.

Hence the work of Mr McKinney and his associates is to be not only commended but seconded; there should be not only encouragement thereof, but co-operation therewith.

Oregon ought in the future to advance quite as fast as Washington, and in proportion to area and present population and development even faster than California. The "Harriman railroads" will help her to do this, but her people, her business men and farmers must help also.—Telegram.

Less than four years ago O H Markham, who was then general freight and passenger agent of the Southern Pacific, began to preach the gospel of creameries for the Willamette Valley, and to give every encouragement to the promotion of the new industry. Figures recently compiled by the Southern Pacific show that there are now in actual operation 29 creameries, nine skimming stations and six cheese factories, the aggregate output of which is valued at about \$400,000. The industry is now regarded as having passed the experimental stage in this region, and large expansion is looked for. The Southern Pacific is still lending it every encouragement, the latest move being to get more pure-bred dairy stock in this field. In this respect General Freight and Passenger Agent Coman is continuing the policy that was so efficiently inaugurated by Mr Markham.

With pests conquered, and they are in part already conquered, Jackson county will win the premium as the prime apple region of the world, perhaps, and certainly will be not second to any other.
