A HINT FROM INDIANA.

That Portland (and Oregon) is far behind in the matter of advertising is well known, not only at home but abroad, says the Portland Journal.

The following extract from a letter by a member of the Indiana Board of Trade, who has traveled considerably in the Northwest and through the East, and who intends to finally invest considerable money in Portland, is of real interest to those who have the welfare of this city at heart.

"Several families have left here in the last few weeks for Seattle, having sold homes and business. I suppose there are now about 100 Crawfordville and Montgomery county people in and about Seattle. These people are all loyal to Seattle, and have a great influence in taking others to that place. Some of them are holding high positions there; in fact, Crawfordville people have the lion's share of the good things at Seattle, including the Post-Intelligencer, of which they have the management and own nearly all the stock. They have leading candidates for Congress, United States senator, chief justice of the supreme court, collector of customs, and about everything else in sight. They are persistent and progressive in advertising Seattle in the East. They have one or more men traveling around all the time talking 'Seattle.' Portland is behind in this advertising business. The Seattle people have nothing to advertise but 'gab!' Their Sunday papers show the bank clearances much the best when compared with Portland. Why don't you get a move on you?"

RATHER SENSATIONAL.

In a document just filed in the British Patent Office, Guglielmo Marconi, the credited inventor of wireless telegraphy, describes that invention as one "communicated to him from abroad by the Marquis Luigi Solari, of Italy."

Great surprise has been caused here by this action of the Italian inventor. The story is printed in the Saturday Review, which treats it as a "startling document" following Prof. Thompson's attacks on the validity of the Marconi patents. In those attacks Prof. Thompson declared that an Italian naval officer named Solari was the real inventor of the wireless telegraphy. In its article on the controversy the Saturday Review says:

"The Official Journal of the Patent Office July 16 contains a patent notice of a very unusual character. It announces that Guglielmo Marconi, who September 10, 1901, had filed a patent in his own name for this invention, now seeks leave to amend the application by converting it into an application for a patent for an invention communicated to him from abroad by the Marquis Luigi Solari, of Italy."—World.

AN OHIO MUDDLE.

In Ohio there is an unusual condition of affairs. The constitution of the state prescribes that there shall be only two kinds of municipal corporations, cities and villages, and declares against any special characters. These very plain provisions of the fundamental law of the state have been violated by republican legislatures for partisan advantage. Whenever a city elected a set of officers ob-

jectionable to the republican machine, a bill was pushed through the legislature putting all the affairs of that city under control of boards appointed by the governor. In this manner George B Cox for years has been the boss of Cincinnati, no matter what officials the people might elect. Recently a similar attempt was made to nullify the work of Tom L Johnson, mayor of Cleveland, and "Golden Rule" Jones, mayor of Toledo. They were practically stripped of all power by special characters rushed through a republican legislature. These characters are now declared unconstitutional and a special session of the legislature is needed to provide forms of city government in these cities. The decision is a just and creditable one.
