orably discharged after some sixteen
months service.

Brother Martin was married in the
year 1882 to Miss Nancy Ann Shelby,
daughter of John and Margaret Shelby,
of Pleasant Hill, Ore., where they have
since resided; has always been well
and favorably known, respected and
loved as a devoted husband, true friend
and worthy citizen.

We shall miss him in our councils;
his ever-welcome presence and aid at
hand-clasp will not soon be forgotten.
