PRESIDENTIAL JEALOUSY.

President Roosevelt has at last given General Miles, commanding general of the army, permission to go to the Philippines, "about the 16th of September." The date fixed is responsible for the charge that President Roosevelt is very willing that General Miles shall be away from the country about the meeting time of the Grand Army encampment.

The honors that would without doubt be heaped on the old general if present, would be far from agreeable to the president. That talk of General Miles as a presidential possibility cannot be the least agreeable about the White House.

Mahlin's Magazine.

The largest users of evening newspaper advertising in Chicago do not use the week-day morning papers at all, and find it hardly necessary to use any of the many extraneous advertising media that are offered. The great middle classes are the largest buyers of advertised articles—people who earn from \$40 to \$100 a month; the majority of them have very little time to devote to a morning paper; those who can afford to do so glance at it hurriedly before breakfast and in a great many cases take it along to read on the cars. The average time consumed between the factory, store or office and the home is, I think, about 25 minutes. This gives very little opportunity for a satisfactory perusal of the morning paper.

President Roosevelt is speech-making up in Maine. His candidacy for the office he holds is like his buffalo hunting—of the strenuous order. He wants an election by the people, and wants it bad. Will he be another victim to the fatality that has attached to the vice-presidential succession? A good many things may happen between now and convention time in 1904.
