The Last Excursion.

The excursion season is drawing to a close and in a short time the summer will be over. Recognizing these facts and wishing to give the people one more chance before it is too late, the Central & Eastern Railroad Co. have decided to run their last through excursion from Detroit to all points west to Newport on Sunday, Aug. 31, 1902, leaving Detroit at 4:30 a.m., arriving at Newport at 11:30, and returning leave Newport at 5:00 p.m., giving six hours of fun and pleasure at the most popular seaside resort in the Northwest. The celebrated band from the U. S. Indian school, Commanaw, of 23 pieces, will play on arrival and departure of the boat and during the day. Special arrangements have been made with Prof. Albert A. Shaw to give one of his famous exhibitions on the unicycle and bicycle on the beach, which together with the surf bathing, boating and open air concerts will be the grand finale of the season.

This is positively the last excursion from Detroit and the fare will be as follows: Detroit to Mill City inclusive \$2.50; west of Mill City to Kingston inclusive, \$2; west of Kingston to Maxwell inclusive, \$1.75; Albany, Corvallis and Philomath, \$1.50; west of Philomath to Whitewood inclusive, \$1.40; west of Whitewood to 75c. These fares are for the round trip. Remember this is the last through excursion of the season.
