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Have Struck Oil.

MYRTLE CREEK, Or., Oct. 6.—The prospects for striking oil here in paying quantities are very good. The company resumed drilling operations last Thursday and are now down 1600 feet and expect to go 600 feet further if necessary to find oil in paying quantities.

A good grade of oil has been struck and every pumpful emptied shows it to be on the increase. The company expect to strike oil any hour now. The drillers, Messrs Foster and Marsh state that the oil is of better grade than that found in the Bakersfield district of California. It has a strong tar-like odor and burns readily when ignited. The citizens are jubilant and are confident that in the near future Myrtle Creek will become a prominent oil producing point.

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WHITEAKER'S FAMOUS RIDE

He Sped Across the Continent to Elect a Democratic Speaker.

Oregonian: The most romantic incident in Governor Whiteaker's life and what brought him most prominently before the country was his famous ride by special train from Oakland, Cal., to Washington. This ride gave opportunity to all the papers in the country for satire and humorous badinage. While elected to the 40th congress Mr. Whiteaker did not repair to the scene of his duties in time to join in the organization of the House. In March the Democrats discovered that to effect their ends one more vote was needed and that vote must be ready on the 18th of March.

Mr. Whiteaker had already sailed from Portland on the steamer Elder for San Francisco. When the Elder cast anchor off Folsom street at 9 o'clock on the morning of the 12th of March, 1879, the agent of the Central Pacific came out in a whitehall boat and informed Mr. Whiteaker that the national committee had a special train in waiting at the Oakland Mole. He left the ship with his hand baggage and was rowed ashore. The ferryboat had been kept in readiness and 30 minutes later Congressman Whiteaker was speeding eastward in an attempt to overtake the overland train which had 25 hours start.

After the fastest trip across the continent on record at that time he reached the capitol on the morning of the 18th in time to cast the decisive vote for the speaker.

The cost of this train was over \$1500 and the New York Times of March 24 contained a long and sarcastic article on the expedients of the Democratic party.

Gov. Whiteaker was always a supporter of home industry and many of his official papers advocated the introduction of a system of manufactures for the working up of Oregon products.

[This is incorrect in several particulars. The congressman-elect was at his home at Pleasant Hill when the Congressional Democratic committee decided that his presence was desirable at Washington to assist in the election of a Democratic speaker of the house of representatives. THE WEEKLY GUARD of March 15, 1879, gives the particulars of the Oregon part of the trip.—ED. GUARD.]

"Hon. John Whiteaker, congressman-elect from this state, left his home in this county Friday the 7th inst., for Washington. A dispatch was received here containing the information of an extra session of congress, and a carriage was at once secured, and started for Mr. Whiteaker's home on Pleasant Hill. Within 15 minutes after the arrival of the carriage, he had doffed his granger habiliments, bade farewell to his family, and was rolling along towards Eugene. Here a special train from Portland met him, and he was soon whirling along on his way to Portland. Arriving there about 3 o'clock in the morning, he was conveyed on board the steamer Elder, which sailed at 5 o'clock."
