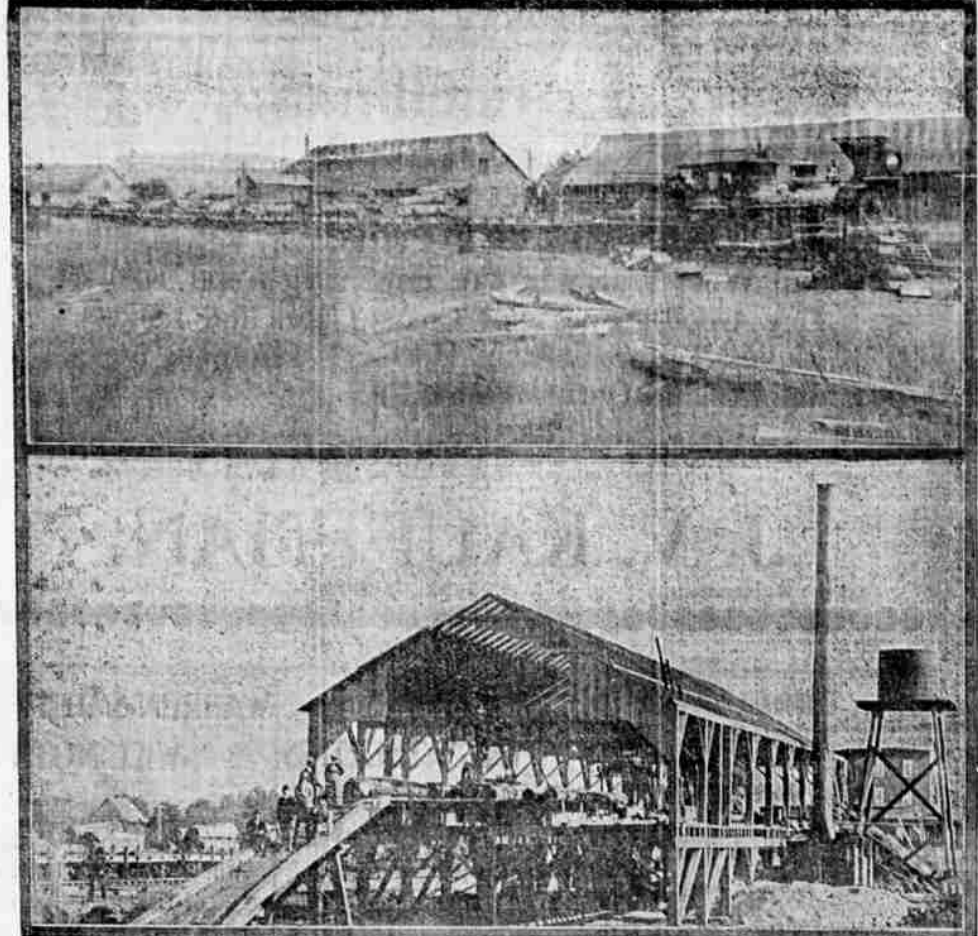

A total eclipse of the moon, visible throughout the United States, will occur on the nights of October 10-17. The circumstances of the eclipse are as follows, the dates being given in Eastern standard time: Moon enters penumbra October 10, 10:17 p. m.; moon enters shadow October 16, 11:17 p. m.; total eclipse begins October 17, 12:19 a. m. Total eclipse ends October 17, 1:48 a. m.; moon leaves shadow October 17, 2:50 a. m.; moon leaves penumbra October 17, 3:50 a. m.
