HANDY PERSONS?

THE CHILDREN'S POET.

Eugene Field's reputation has grown in Missouri, his native state, since his death to an extent that it should have flourished before that sad and untoward event. On the first Friday in November the public schools of Missouri are to celebrate his name at the request of the state superintendent, and he is to be practically canonized as the patron saint of childhood.

Eugene Field wrote columns of amusing comment, of delightful humor and peppery paragraphs, but it is seen now, less than seven years after his death, that he is remembered for his half-smiling, half pathetic poetry about children; and the rest is fading in dimness. It is the one touch of nature that makes all the world "kin" to him. His poetry grows more attractive every year, though he wrote too little of it. No one can fill his place as a singer of child sentiment, as no one had occupied it before him, and when all of his poems are collected it makes only a little book.

KING EDWARD'S KITCHEN.

The chefs, cooks, roasters, etc, in the king of England's kitchen are all French and Italians. Seven of them receive salaries varying from \$2,000 to \$4,000 a year. King Edward, like his late mother, exacts the most scrupulously punctuality for his meals. At Windsor the breakfast meals are served at 7:30; and 10:30 in the morning; lunch at 2:30; tea at 5:30; dinner at 8, and supper at 11:30.

There are eight kitchens, containing 800 saucepans, 180 frying pans, 150 grills, 70 stewpans, 35 automatic roasting spits, 8,000 forks, 4,000 knives, 8,000 spoons and 15,000 silver plates and dishes. The whole valued at about \$10,000,000, and in the keeping of the yeomen of the king's house.
