COMBINE THE WOOL CROP.

Plans are being formulated to combine the entire wool clip of the Willamette Valley. Wools will be graded and baled to meet trade requirements and shipped direct to Eastern mills, saving all middle profits. It is estimated that under the new methods of selling that it will add to the profits of the growers over \$100,000 now going into the pockets of the middlemen. One of the largest wool warehouses in Portland has been secured and it is being fitted up with baling machinery and grading tables. When wools are all in shape for market, sales will be advertised East and then sold under sealed bids. Having several million pounds together and properly picked, it will warrant Eastern buyers to send out their buyers to buy direct from the range. The largest grower in the valley is S. Philippi of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, who is engineering the proposition. Willamette Valley Growers Union.
