Reserve-Land Robbery.

The forest reserve scheme is good in principle, yet in practice it has been used to cover most notorious spoliation of the public domain.

The owners of large tracts of worthless "grant" lands, given them by the government in the first place, conspire to have a part of or all their grants covered by forest reserves.

GOVERNOR CHAMBERLAIN Keeps up his reputation for being on the right side at the right time.

"There is no reason whatever for the creation of these reserves. You can quote me as saying that if the reserves in Curry, Josephine, and Lake counties are created, the effect will be to retard the development of those sections of the state and evidently for no other purpose than to enrich the men who own large tracts of land in the area withdrawn from entry.

"They have sold off the best of it and want to relinquish the remainder and secure 'scrip' in return, which they can use to take valuable lands in other parts of the state. By this means they can give up their worthless lands and secure good lands, and when a homestead seeker goes to take up a homestead he will find that the Government has nothing to offer that is worth taking.

"I am also informed that the Oregon & California Railroad Company has thousands of acres of land of little value in the proposed Southwestern Oregon reserve. If that reserve is created the owners of that land will be permitted to exchange its lands for valuable lands elsewhere, with the result that all the best lands will be owned by large corporations.

"That not only sounds right, but is right. And only those who have traveled over the worthless lands of the military wagon road on the other side of the mountains after the road leaves the Lane county boundary line on the summit of the Cascades, can appreciate the gigantic steal involved in giving back those worse than worthless lands to the government in exchange for valuable timber.

But even with Hermann out of power we doubt if the thieves may be checkmated. If the owners of the Military Road grant can get but a fair per cent of their lands into a reserve it will make them big money. Eighty thousand acres at the low price of ten dollars per acre means EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS. And all profit.

Note and Comment.

WORD FROM WASHINGTON

No More Surveys for Oregon on Account of Irregularities.

Hermann's Regime in Land Office Upset Affairs So Much That a Thorough Overhauling is Necessary.

The statement that comes from Washington concerning the order stopping further surveys of lands in Oregon is:

"Washington, D. C., May 15.—The commissioner of the General Land Office has decided that there shall be no further surveys of public lands in Oregon this year. The fraudulent taking of lands by alleged settlers for the benefit of corporations and syndicates is the cause. This decision of the General Land Office grows out of the frauds practiced and exposed during the Hermann administration of the land affairs and which brought about Hermann's removal.

"It is regretted at the Department here that the innocent are compelled to suffer with the guilty, for many persons in good faith have gone upon 100 acres of unsurveyed lands intending to make bona fide homes and fulfill the provisions of the law.

"But, owing to the course pursued by the former Land Commissioner, and the necessity of going to the bottom of the matter, it is found necessary to cease work in surveying the lands, which will be deferred to a time so distant that great hardship will be wrought upon the working people who have gone into Oregon and begun to build homes.

GREEN'S REPORT INACCESSIBLE

"The special report of A. R. Green, appointed to examine into the facts, is on file with the department as a confidential document. It is the custom of the Department, in cases wherein these REPORTS ARE ACCUSATORY OF ANY OFFICIAL OR REFLECT IN ANY MANNER UPON HIS INTEGRITY OR EFFICIENCY, TO MARK THEM 'CONFIDENTIAL' AND RETAIN THEM FROM THE PUBLIC. This has been done with Green's report, and only through the consent of the Hermann people could it be released for publication.

"Efforts have been made to secure it, but they have failed. A request from the Hermann people of Oregon would operate to remove the ban of secrecy. It would end all difficulty in getting at a report that seems to be largely the pivot of the whole question."
