Pickled Salmon Shuts Out the Canned Article.

The Astoria Daily Budget says that while the run of salmon in the Columbia River has been small and erratic this season, the cold storage men have already beat the record for 1902, with three weeks of fishing season left.

The reason for this is that the fish have averaged large and of excellent quality, thus bringing six cents a pound—too much to warrant handling at the canneries, and they have accordingly been turned over to the cold storage. It was only a few years ago that the pickling of fish for the Eastern markets was commenced on this river, but it has already reached enormous proportions and bids fair within the coming few years as new markets are opened up to be greatly increased. Nothing better could be desired, as these plants employ white labor exclusively and pay the highest prices for raw fish. That is what the fishermen and business men want.

For the first time in its history the sub-treasury at San Francisco has made a requisition supply for nickles and cent pieces. Cent pieces stand for economy and solid prosperity, but for some reason peculiar to itself, the Pacific Coast has been a long time reaching the one cent stage.

The race problem assumes some peculiar phases on this Pacific Coast. In Central California, just now, there are quite a number of white children, boys and girls—employed in picking berries for Chinamen. The white men lease the land to the Chinamen and the Chinamen hire the white children to gather the crop.

Cardinal Logue, of Ireland, says Cardinal Gibbons would be an object of commiseration should he be elected Pope, and that "no American would care to spend the rest of his life shut up in the Vatican." Cardinal Gibbons and Logue are the only English speaking members of the sacred college. If elected, however, Cardinal Gibbons could and would of course introduce English speaking people about him.

Of course unthinking Irish agitators have to do something when during the visit of King Edward and his queen to the green island. Many cases of vandalism in the tearing down of decorations in Cork were reported yesterday. The old and Irish man is always "agin the government."

Why blame old man Williams, mayor of Portland, sometimes called the Grand Old Man of Multnomah county politics, for the flutful failure of his city administration, when he was put on the ticket on the theory that he would be a ratty partisan mayor who would not seriously interfere with any living graft. The Portland gang do not want a vigorous man for mayor, still less an able man with a

mind of his own, and the energy to enforce well-defined policies that are anti-graft.—Salem Journal.

Ten years is the limit in Oregon.

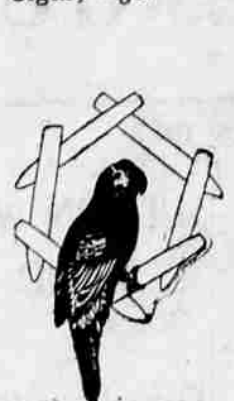
