PORTLAND AND COAST SHIPPING

San Francisco Getting All the Business of Oregon Coast Towns.

(Special Correspondence.)

Mapleton, July 30.—With a fleet of eight schooners and a large steamer making regular trips from this port to San Francisco, the coastwise trade is being monopolized by the San Francisco line. The improvement of the bar at the mouth of the river, becomes more and more apparent. Some day Oregon capitalists, and more especially those of Portland, may possibly awake to the fact that while they are trying to hog everything for Portland and the Columbia River, San Francisco is making friends along the whole coast and taking the pie from their very doors. Some day they may realize that the only way to make a thriving metropolis of Portland is to improve the whole state; but then when?

The mills are all running to about their full capacity, vessels are coming and going in spite of the low water, logging camps are running as they were never before run here, new camps are being established, the hay crop is enormous and has been taken care of in good shape, but the supply is away short of the demand, and large quantities will be shipped here from California and sold for from fifteen to twenty dollars per ton. A large profit on all this industry goes to San Francisco.

This is a picture of what is being done at all of the Oregon ports from Tillamook down.

Why don't we buy Oregon hay when Oregon farmers have hay to burn?

Why do we buy so much California flour?

Why does all of our merchandise come from San Francisco?

Why does all of our lumber go to California?

And last, is there such a place as Portland in Oregon? And if there is do they do any business beside hogging?

SIUSLAW LOGGING AND OTHER NOTES

The O. W. Hurd Company's mill at Florence is nearing completion, and their tug, the Roseco, will shortly be here when they will be able to push their business much faster.

Myer & Kyle have finished their dock at Mapleton and it is a credit to the company and the town.

Joe Stemmens has just completed a large barn.

The Mapleton Hotel is doing a good business.

The capacity of the Mapleton feed stable will soon be doubled as it is proved that it is unable to supply the accommodations needed.
