## THE WATER COMPANY REPLIES

Explains Where the Water Comes from and How It Is Secured.

Eugene, Or., Aug. 21, 1903.

Editor Guard: A few days since there appeared in the Guard a letter from Mr. Schwarzschild, of Eugene, asking a public statement from the Eugene Water Company as to the Eugene water supply, and intimating at the same time that it was his opinion and the popular opinion of the community, that it comes from the river.

If such a misapprehension prevails, we are sincerely glad that Mr. Schwarzschild has called attention to it and thus given us an occasion and opportunity to correct it, and at the same time give full information concerning this very important matter. There is no subject which more vitally concerns a community than that of the water supply, for it involves public health, convenience, and fire protection.

When the Eugene Water Company was first organized, the water for the city supply was pumped direct from the Willamette just below the bridge across the river north of town. Thorough investigation had determined that the water of the Willamette was pure and of good quality, and being accessible and very abundant, was regarded at that time the best source available.

In the progress of the city, a sewer system was established, and the sewerage of the city was discharged into the mill race, just above its confluence with the river, and only a few hundred yards above the before mentioned water supply. Soon as the Eugene Water Company ascertained that the sewerage was to discharge at this point, immediate steps were taken to find another source for the water to be supplied to the city.

In pursuance of this purpose a very large well was constructed at the site of the present water station, a well which for the most of the season, has a capacity of twenty-five or thirty thousand gallons an hour, which is ample for all purposes. The water pumped from this well is forced into the large reservoir on Skinner's or Shelton's flume, and thence, by gravitation, and pressure amounting at the maximum about 120 pounds to the square inch, supplies all parts of the city. This well has been the sole source of city supply from the time it was constructed until last year, except during about two months of the hottest and driest part of the summer, when to meet the increased demands for water on account of irrigation, water was pumped direct from the Willamette at a point east of Midgley's mill, this point being about a quarter of a mile above the sewerage discharge before mentioned. Last year, 1902, the company determined to abandon its connection with the river entirely and find water sufficient for all purposes at all times of the year, by a new well. Accordingly a well was constructed close to the bank of the Willamette, east of Midgley's mill, where a very large flow of water of the very best quality was found, and we hoped at the time, that this would augment the supply from the old well as to meet all demands for the old well as to meet all demands for many years, but the flow to this well was not quite up to our anticipations, and the unusual growth of Eugene has almost doubled the demand for water, and this with the waste and abuse of water on the part of many consumers, has put our supply close to the limit during the very dry weather which has recently prevailed. The company is trying to promptly meet this emergency, by constructing a large filter or percolator, from the well to the river. It is universally conceded that there is a large flow of water through the stratum of gravel which underlies the soil all over the valley, and that this flow comes for the most part from the river. That this is true there is no question, and further the water of the Willamette Valley has the reputation of being as good, if not the best, in the United States. Then, again, there is no question that there are numerous subterranean channels through this gravel, if they could be found, carrying an immense volume of water, such a flow was in fact found at the old well. Then, if this is true, that there is a large underground flow of water through the gravel which supplies all this country, and if the water flowing through the gravel is thus purified, then it follows that if a channel is constructed from our well to the river, in which natural conditions are faithfully reproduced, the water thus reaching the well must be as good and as pure as that originally in the well. Now this is exactly what the Eugene Water Company is doing. We are trying to increase the volume of water to the well, without any sacrifice or loss as to the quality, by making a channel direct from well to river, which channel is filled with gravel and sand with the addition of charcoal, if we can get it, through

which the water must filter and percolate and thus purify before it can reach the well. By this channel thus constructed, we quickly reach the same result exactly as if we should by good fortune find such a flow by digging for it.

### PURITY OF THE WATER.

It has always been the sincere desire and policy of the company to furnish the very best water obtainable, and in this we have been very successful. Soon after the construction of the first well, the company had a very exhaustive test of the water from the well, and also from the river at the point of connection with the water station. The first test was made by Professor McClure under the supervision of Professor Collier, who at that time was Professor of Chemistry in the Oregon State University. The date indicates for the water of the well especially, a purity which cannot be exceeded by any water from any source in the world, in fact as nearly absolutely pure as possible, and that from the river is a very close second, having but a small per cent. more of a trace of albuminoid ammonia, the only trace of all of any organic substance whatever in either water. This test has been followed by a long series of tests and analyses by the most competent authorities to be found. Professor McClure, after he became Professor of Chemistry in the University, repeatedly tested the water, always with the first result, then Professor Lachman, one of the best chemists in the United States, made a test and found the water absolutely pure.

Dr. Prentice has tested the water also, almost every month of every year, and declares it to be absolutely pure, and has always found it so. Professor Washburne, of the Oregon State University and at the time State Biologist, made a careful test of the Eugene water supply, taking it from the hydrants, and not only made a chemical test, as others had done before, but a biological or microscopical test, making it thorough and exhaustive and with the same results as all former examinations, namely, that it is absolutely free from contamination of any kind. The Oregon State Board of Health has very recently made a test along the same lines as that of Professor Washburne, and they also found a purity not exceeded by the water supply of any city in this country. After all this it must follow that the statement made by the Eugene correspondent of the Telegram, is a tissue of malicious and willful falsehood from beginning to end, and no man could make such a statement who has not lost all sense of truthfulness and honesty.

The Eugene Water Company has nothing to conceal from the public concerning the source or character of the city water supply, but know that the water and the service will favorably compare with that of any other company or municipality in this country. The Eugene correspondent for the Telegram makes the statement that the Eugene water supply, which he declares comes from the river, has been found upon test to be very impure, and that it has been the occasion of much of the sickness which has been prevailing at this place. No more malicious or false statement could be uttered by any man. In the first place very little sickness which under any circumstances could be attributed to water, has occurred at Eugene at any time, for Eugene is one of the most healthful localities in Oregon; and such cases as have occurred at all have easily been traceable to local water supply, which when abandoned and replaced by city water, the disease has immediately ceased.

The fact is, that Eugene city water, has been demonstrated not only by chemical and biological tests but by the very certain one of its use for fifteen years, to be of such exceptionally high quality, that some members of the present city Board of Health, have discussed the advisability, if it could be done at all, of closing all the wells of the city and having every one use the city water, and thus afford absolute protection against such diseases as are borne by water.

It is the intention of the company from now on to furnish an ample supply of water wholly from wells, which are to be carefully guarded and frequently tested, and to so extend and improve the service, as to meet the demands of any possible future development of Eugene, and to afford all who desire it the benefit and convenience of the city water.
