## WOMAN IN CLUTCHES OF LAW

### Mrs. C. W. Powell Forges Orders and Secures Much Goods

#### Arrested at Irving and Spent Last Night in Jail—Was Leaving Her Husband and the Country

Mrs. C. W. Powell, who lives 10 h of Eugene on the river road, was arrested last night about 10 o'clock at Irving by Chief of Police Stiles for forging an order for goods and for forging two other orders. At the time of her arrest she was waiting for a train to carry her out of the country, her intention being to leave her husband and let him settle the difficulty.

Yesterday Mrs. Powell raised a 25-cent order given her husband by Geo. E. Hall in Mrs. W. J. Fox, the mill liner, to \$1.75 and secured goods there to that amount. Later she forged an order on S. H. Friendly for goods to the amount of \$31.45, and one on E. B. Dunn for about \$20, in each instance signing Mr. Hall's name. It soon became apparent to these merchants that the orders were a forgery, and the officers were notified, the woman's arrest following. She spent the night in the county jail.

It seems that Mrs. Powell and her husband, who are poor people, have been having trouble between themselves and she states that she was leaving him, thinking that he would settle for the goods gotten by her through the forged orders and that there would be no trouble about it.

RELEASED FROM CUSTODY.

The woman was taken before Justice of the Peace Wintermeyer this afternoon. Merchants Friendly and Dunn not having the disposition to prosecute her, she was allowed to plead guilty to simple larceny, and judgment was suspended upon her returning what goods she had not used and paying cash for what she had worn. The sum paid was \$6.93.
