PROBING ELECTION FRAUDS

New York Grand Jury at Work on the Cases

Many Witnesses Are in Attendance
— Six Arrests Have Been Made and One Has Confessed

New York, Nov. 13.—District Attorney Jerome's assistants, Sanford and Perkins, this morning instituted John Doe proceedings in the Sixth, Fourteenth and Twenty-ninth assembly districts in election fraud cases. The proceedings are said to be the result of new evidence obtained by Superintendent of Election Morgan's men, who this morning sent several witnesses to the district attorney's

office. Great secrecy is maintained. The grand jury resumed its inquiry into the election frauds this morning, many witnesses being in attendance.

New York, Nov. 13.—The grand jury this afternoon returned eight indictments for illegal voting. Six were arrested on election day. Warrants are out for others. It is understood the grand jury has ordered other indictments drawn. Those arrested are John Kroup, Albert Farar, Thomas P. Grady, John P. Foley, Allan Mead, Thomas Brennan, Thomas Hall. It is reported Kroup has confessed, implicating one "higher up."

DETERMINED

Des Moines, Iowa, Nov. 13.—After fighting all night with his wife, who tried to prevent him committing suicide, Clarence Reeve, aged 34, took acid this morning with fatal results.

Washington, Nov. 13.—Secretary Shaw authorizes the statement that he will not go to the relief of the money market until convinced that business interests are likely to suffer. Should any business concern be denied desired credit at reasonable rates the secretary says he wants to know the facts.

OHIO GAMBLING STATUTE

Anyone Can Bring Suit to Recover Money Lost

The Penalty Is Adjudged to Become a Lien Against Building Where Money is Lost Gambling

Washington, Nov. 13.—The supreme court of the United States today upheld the peculiar Ohio law which permits any resident of the state to recover money lost at gambling, regardless of by whom lost. A woman brought suit against the owners of the building in which the player lost, and the lien against the building, created by the state law, was declared valid by the highest court today.

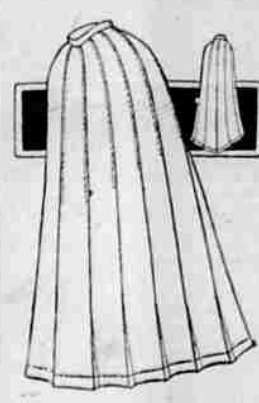

A FUGITIVE SURRENDERS

Honolulu, Nov. 13. United States Marshal Hendry, of the state of Washington, has returned from Maui on the steamer Likepine, having in custody G. L. Brokaw, who is under indictment by a federal jury at Spokane for land frauds. The prisoner will be taken to Oahu prison. After a preliminary hearing it is expected Brokaw will be returned to Spokane. Brokaw gave himself up to the sheriff of Maui.
