Need Some Hop Laws

Hop buyers seem to be alike everywhere. To the uninformed it seems strange that this business could not be conducted on an honorable basis, but it seems such is not the case. When a grower sells to a dealer, the dealer has had samples then must sample each bale and strange to say he finds many bales of inferior quality, but never finds one better than his original sample. He then will not accept those he has so wisely refused unless they are given to him. The original sample is drawn by the dealer and taken at random from the lot and is, of course, as a rule a fair sample, but every grower finds the same experience, knows when he sells how to expect a holdup.

Last year the legislature of Oregon passed a law making five pounds tare on a bale of hops, but some of the unscrupulous have deducted seven pounds tare, evading the state law, and as our energetic law-makers failed to make a penalty for evasion of the law it might as well not be on the books.

Oregon needs a state hop inspector, whose duty it shall be to grade or by some means protect the hop growing industry and not allow a set of men the privilege of milking the producers.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that, in pursuance of a resolution of the common council of the city of Eugene, duly and regularly adopted on the 20th day of December, 1905, a special election will be held in the city of Eugene on Tuesday, the 24th day of January, 1906, for the purpose of submitting to a vote of the qualified electors of said city the questions:

1. Shall the city of Eugene issue its bonds in the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of deriving funds with which to construct, erect, acquire, own, maintain, manage and operate a complete system of electric lights for the purpose of lighting the streets and public buildings of the city and furnishing lights for private citizens?

2. Shall the city of Eugene issue its bonds in the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of deriving funds with which to construct or purchase, acquire, maintain, own, manage and operate a complete system of water works, with all necessary implements and appliances, and such real property, within or without the city, as may be necessary or convenient therefor, for the supply of water to the city and citizens of the city of Eugene and vicinity?

Said election to be held in each of the four wards of the city of Eugene, and the voting places and officers to conduct said election being as follows:

First Ward—Judges, E. B. Rutan, E. R. Mumme and S. R. Williams; Mumme and Williams designated as clerks. Polling place at the truck house on East Eleventh street.

Second Ward—Judges, D. R. Lakin, Dwight Hopkins, and R. McMurphy; Hopkins and McMurphy designated as clerks. Polling place, engine room, city hall building, on East Eighth street.

Third Ward—Judges, Sherman Heller, B. D. Paine and A. C. Jennings; Paine and Jennings designated as clerks. Polling place at Butler's upholstery room, corner West Seventh and Olive streets.

Fourth Ward—Judges, Thomas Brown, Geo. O. Yoran and Wm. Hodges; Yoran and Hodges designated as clerks. Polling place at Thompson's Dye Works, on south side of West Eighth street.

And the polls thereof will be opened at 8 o'clock a.m. and kept open until 6 o'clock p.m. on said 24th day of January, 1906.

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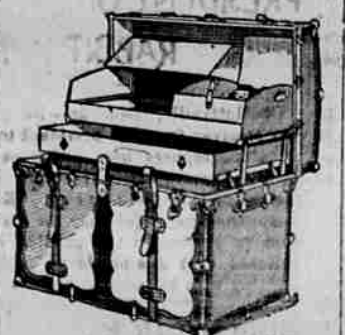
