With a white man on the scaffold and twenty-five Texas sheriffs for an audience at San Antonio the other day, a male negro quartet from the jail sang "God Be With You 'Till We Meet Again." A very pretty arrangement, still we suppose the man who had made it possible was not appreciative.

A terrible tale, that from Caledonia, Minn., where the other day, infatuated with Pearl Wheaton, daughter of one of the richest farmers in Southern Minnesota, and rendered desperate by her refusal to marry him, Matt Styer, a dental student at the University of Minnesota, broke into the Wheaton home, fatally shot Pearl and her sister Ruth, and the mother of the girls, and then turned the weapon on himself.

Senator Depew denies any intention of resigning from the directorate of the Vanderbilt railroad lines, averring that it will not interfere with his duties in the senate. 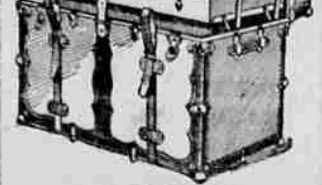
