Northern Girl-Slave Trade

From a current report in the hands of the British Columbia authorities it is learned that at Cape Mudge, up about the Alaska coast, there are families of halfbreeds, both men and women, showing little of the Indian.

"Girls with white skins, dark brown hair braided down their backs, big innocent children eyes, are being sold today and have been sold for years to the highest bidders. The slave masters are the Cape Mudge Indians, the slaves are white because their grandmothers were sold before them to white men, and when their grandmothers wandered back to the tribe, deserted and abandoned, they brought baby girls with them and in the course of time the male relatives of these abandoned children sold these baby girls, too, when they grew up to young girlhood.

Thus there have grown up slave dealers in Cape Mudge, who have become rich and powerful by the barter in quarter, eighth and sixteenth breed girls. They have created a market which is constantly growing, and the demand has become so great that other markets have been sought, and it is reported that Rock Bay Indians are embarking in this awful industry."

Proposed Tax Law

Blank petitions attached to copies of the new tax code proposed by the tax committee of the Willamette Development League are now in circulation for signatures, one of which may be signed at the Guard office. The plan is to secure 7500 signatures to the petitions and have the bill submitted to the voters of the state at the election in June of this year. There remain only thirty days within which the required number of signatures may be secured.

The bill not only proposes new forms of taxation, such as an increase of the tax on insurance companies, taxes on the gross earnings of express, telephone and telegraph companies, taxes on Pullman, oil tank and refrigerator car companies, but also revises the general tax laws now in force. Sign it.
