ARRESTED

He and an Astoria Married Woman in Trouble at Salem

Lee R. Minard and Mrs. Bertha B. Reid, who were arrested at Salem last night on the charge of adultery, were arraigned before Justice Turner this afternoon, and were bound over to the circuit court, says the Salem Journal. The charge against the man was changed to lewd cohabitation, and his bond was fixed at \$250, while the woman's bond was placed at \$500. Captain John Reid, of Astoria, husband of the woman, swore out the complaints.

Reid, who is in anything but a pleasant frame of mind, arrived on the local train last evening and at once told Sheriff Colver that he thought his wife was living with another man in this city. Colver detailed Deputies Minto and Egan on the case, and they soon had the pair located in a saloon, where they had gone to have a social glass. They were then shadowed to their room in the Eldridge block, from there to the theatre, where they witnessed the production of the "American Tramp," and from the theatre to the saloon again. They also stopped at the Elite cafe for refreshments and then went to their room, where they were arrested by the officers, after they had been given time to retire for the night and indisputable evidence of their guilt had been obtained.

Minard is a saloon keeper, and was the proprietor of a saloon at Cottage Grove, in which a woman was killed a year ago, and an unsuccessful attempt was made to connect him with the crime.

The woman is good looking, well dressed, and wears two large diamond rings.

When Reid was asked by the court if he had a marriage license to show that the woman was his wife replied: "Yes, two of them." It seems that the couple were divorced once, and were remarried.

She claims the reason she left him was because he abused her. They waived preliminary examination and were bound over. So far their attorney, Web Holmes, has been unsuccessful in securing bondsmen.

FISHED OUT OF SEASON

A. A. Hollenbeck Fined \$50 for Catching Salmon

Had His Nets in the Siuslaw River and Was Caught Red-Handed by Deputy Warden Steear

A. A. Hollenbeck, an old resident of Mapleton, was fined \$50 by Justice of the Peace B. H. Fisk, of Mapleton precinct, last Saturday for catching salmon out of season.

It appears that Hollenbeck had been setting his nets in the Siuslaw river at Mapleton for some time before his arrest. Deputy Fish Warden Steear had warned him to desist from his unlawful practice but the warning was not heeded. The warden finally concluded to "lay for" the offender and arose very early Saturday morning and proceeded to the place where Hollenbeck was reported to have set his nets, a short distance above Kyle's wharf. He found them there and waited for their owner to show up. About 4 o'clock Hollenbeck appeared and began hauling in one of the nets when to his surprise he found Warden Steear hold of one end of the net, he having already unfished it. Hollenbeck quietly remarked that he guessed he was caught this time and agreed to appear before Justice Fisk that day. He pleaded guilty and the lowest fine was imposed upon him. His nets and boats were confiscated, as provided by law.
